Although Christmas is a wonderful celebration, and although most of us greatly enjoy it, it's a difficult season for others. It's difficult for a variety of

reasons. However, the difficulty usually results from a hardship in their life.

Perhaps they've suffered a recent loss. Perhaps they find themselves separated from family and friends. Perhaps they're dealing with an illness that keeps them homebound. Perhaps, in a season of gift-giving, they find themselves experiencing financial hardship.

These hardships cause us emotional struggles not only during the holidays. They can pose a problem for our faith all year long. They often cause us to question God. They cause us to question the character of God.

The question that naturally enters our mind as we deal with our difficulties is "Why?" We ask God why he would allow us to suffer in this way. We ask how he could allow it in our life.

In times like this, be begin to question the love of God. After all, if God truly loves us, it doesn't make sense that he would allow sufferings in our life. If he's all-powerful, as the Bible teaches, then he's certainly able to protect us from harm. And a loving God would do just that.

If he is loving, then the other conclusion we can draw is that he's not as powerful as we've believed him to be. Again, if he loves us, he should protect us. And since we're not protected from the evils of this life, perhaps he's unable to help.

The only other conclusion we can make is that there is no God. We think that all of the suffering and evil in the world proves that he doesn't exist. And, because of this, we stop worshipping him altogether.

The Bible is clear that God does exist. It's clear that God is loving. And it's clear that he's all-powerful. So why does he allow suffering in our life?

The answer to this question is multifaceted. And that's what we're going to look at over the course of several weeks following Christmas. I'll deliver a series of messages looking at why God allows evil in our life, and why he allows us to suffer.

It's my prayer that, as we consider this difficult question, your faith in the Lord will be renewed. I pray that it will remove this struggle from your heart and mind. And I pray that you'll be better equipped to share Christ with those who are hurting.

"Come, let us sing for joy to the Lord; let us shout aloud to the Rock of our salvation. Let us come before Him with thanksgiving and extol him with music and song. For the Lord is the great God, the great King above all gods." Psalm 95:1-3

I have been a fan of music ever since I was a youngster. I enjoy listening to it, playing it, singing it, feeling it; there are so many ways to experience music. For many people, the holidays are the time to break out those cheery classics and carols that are apparently only socially acceptable to play for about a month (and then non-stop in that month). We love those tunes. One aspect that I particularly appreciate is the celebratory nature of those songs.

While this is good of us to praise Jesus for coming to earth, our praise shouldn't stop there. As people who have been forgiven of our sin and bought back through the cross, we have so much to be grateful for. We of all people should be bursting at the seams with praise and adoration. Why is it then that sometimes singing songs of worship seems to be such a chore, or even a bore? I would suggest that it is because we have turned our focus on ourselves. Instead of joyfully proclaiming (in tune or out of tune) the richness of our reality in Christ, we think about ourselves and how we like other songs better or other styles better. It is healthy to remember that these times of worship are never about us...they are always about God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.

So, as we continue celebrating this season, and indeed as we find ourselves singing all year long, remember why we sing. Let our songs be songs of Joy to the Lord. May our voices rise to shouts of adoration to the Rock of our salvation. We have been given a great gift in life; let's use it to glorify the great Giver of that gift.
