# **October**, 2015



"You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house." (Matthew 5:14-15 ESV)

I've never had a desire to stand out. I've never desired to be the focus of attention. I prefer, instead, to blend in. I desire to go unnoticed. And this desire has reflected itself in many ways.

It's reflected in the way that I dress. I've never cared for bright colors. I've never cared for flashy clothing or accessories. I don't like wearing things that will make me stand out or draw attention to myself.

Even though I'm a pastor, I tend to be more quiet and soft-spoken. I don't like to speak loudly,

drawing attention to myself. And I certainly don't like to shout. I tend to speak few words and, when I do speak, to say them in a normal tone of voice.

Even though my position requires me to be up front in the church, this isn't the position I normally choose. If attending a worship service that I'm not leading, or when attending a conference, I tend to sit somewhere in the middle. I prefer to simply blend in with the crowd.

And even though I do what I can to fulfill my calling, I have no desire to be a well-known figure. I have no desire for fame. I prefer to live the guiet life.

I'm not alone in this preference to go unnoticed. Many people feel the same way. And, so often, this mindset finds its way into our life of faith.

We know that Jesus has called us to be his witnesses. We know that he's called us to proclaim the gospel to the whole creation. And, quite frankly, we're hesitant to do this. We're hesitant because we don't want to be the focus of everyone's attention. We prefer, instead, to keep

our mouth shut and blend in with the world around us.

In the past, this is something that's hindered my witness. It's kept me from reaching out to those around me. My desire to blend in caused me to shove any concern for the lost to the back of my mind as a desire for conformity took hold.

However, as we see in the above passage, we're called to stand out. We are the light of the world. And a light is not something that is hidden.


As the people of God, we're distinct from the world around us. But we're distinct not to draw attention to ourselves. We shine forth to draw the world's attention to Christ.

We're called to be distinct as a testimony to those in our midst. We're called to let our light shine that God might be glorified. We're called to be his witnesses that others might receive the salvation Jesus provided for all men.

This doesn't mean we have to be a loud mouth. It doesn't mean that we must be obnoxious. But we must not hide our light in order to fit in. Doing so means abandoning a lost world to sin and eternal condemnation.



A New Gospel By Jordan Langness

6 I am amazed that you are so quickly deserting Him who called you by the grace of Christ, for a different gospel; 7 which is really not another; only there are some who are disturbing you and want to distort the gospel of Christ. 8 But even if we, or an angel from heaven, should preach to you a gospel contrary to what we have preached to you, he is to be accursed! 9 As we have said before, so I say again now, if any man is preaching to you a gospel contrary to what you received, he is to be accursed! 10 For am I now seeking the favor of men, or of God? Or am I striving to please men? If I were still trying to please men, I would not be a bond-servant of Christ. –Galatians 1:6-10

Throughout a study of 'secular' history as well as the history recorded in the pages of Scripture, we see several instances of people gathering behind false teachings and distortions of the Word of God. The impact and notoriety of these groups differs according to how history remembers the cumulative effect of this false teaching, but there is always a cost. Where history maybe fails us is in determining what cost is greater. For example, consider the tragedy of the 1978 cult suicide of 913 people who literally followed Jim Jones to death. Now maybe that reference doesn't mean too much on its own, but its impact may be more noted as the impetus behind the phrase "Don't drink the Kool-aid". On a different spectrum, we have the 'mainline' cults of today that deny the deity of Jesus, the existence of the Trinity, or other key tenants of Christian dogma. Sources for potentially hearing a different gospel in this day and age are near endless.

While it is true that we should be alert and informed about the groups that are indeed peddling

false gospels out there (i.e. the Jehova's Witnesses, Mormons, and Jesus Only groups which are all locally active in Beulah), my main thrust for us today is really to take a look a little deeper at ourselves. Please don't get offended by this statement, but I believe we are becoming largely an undiscerning people. In our fanaticism for all things simple and easy, we no longer do the hard work of checking things out before we spread them as truth. Allow me to share a personal story as an example. One day while I was on facebook, I stumbled across a post that an acquaintance shared regarding scientists discovering that dna actually contained code that could be interpreted as language and included a little section stating that when translated, the decoded DNA message mirrored biblical text proclaiming God as Creator. I thought that was really neat and shared that on my wall as well...which some other friends also then posted on their wall. There were a few people who raised the question of how DNA could contain a coded language, to which I responded that we have examples of language and code using less than four "letters": Morse code and binary code for example. Well, eventually I decided to look a little deeper into it and discovered that the group that posted this article was a satirical website that was totally fake. There were no credentials, no real evidence....it was a hoax; and I fell for it.

The thing that saddens me more than my gullibility on facebook is what I see happening in the church....especially amongst the younger generations. Instead of indiscriminately reposting facebook links, we instead indiscriminately accept what people say about or teach regarding the Bible, and the truths inside. How else could you explain the rampant acceptance and celebration of "big name" preachers who miss so many of the basics of Christianity like repentance, forgiveness, sin, hell, etc. How else can you explain the church's shifting understanding of significant moral issues that society and media are forcing upon us? These words of Paul are a healthy exhortation for us today just as they were for the church in Galatia. Have you accepted a gospel other than the gospel of Christ? How would you know? Think about it.

**Statement on Biblical Marriages** – Jordan discussed that the church leadership in Minot felt like it had to come together in light of the gay marriage ruling from the Supreme Court. They have a statement prepared stating what marriage is and scriptural basis for it. This is not a petition, but a statement that we can sign and affirm what we believe. The statement would be put in the newspapers, with the Pastor's signatures – it would not have the signatures of individual members but possibly have how many members of the church signed it.

We will put an announcement in the bulletin and have the statement out so our members can sign it.

**Tithe** – Our tithe of \$2758.41 will be given to AFLC Home Missions.
