"For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain. If I am to live in the flesh, that means fruitful labor for me. Yet which I shall choose I cannot tell. I am hard

pressed between the two. My desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better. But to remain in the flesh is more necessary on your account."

(Philippians 1:21-24 ESV)

Most of us have experienced the loss of someone near to us, so the struggle is a familiar one. It's something my family is dealing with as my mother was just put in the care of hospice. Cancer has quickly ravaged her health, and she will soon enter into the presence of the Savior.

This is never easy to deal with, even when the one suffering is a person of faith. However, one of the thoughts that's been

on my mind lately is this: In times like this, it's easy for us to forget the hope we have in Christ. It's easy for us to become so fixated on our loss, that we forget the blessings in store for the one who is dying.

As Paul wrote the words in the above verses, he was in prison. He didn't know the fate that awaited him. However, he knew that he might be put to death.

Yet, the thought of death didn't intimidate him. He said that to live is Christ and to die is gain. And he then explains to us what he means by this.

If he's to live, it means that he will have continued opportunities to serve Christ. But if he dies, he gains an even greater blessing: He would be with Christ. He didn't know which he would choose, if it were up to him. He knew that there was an ongoing need for the ministry with which

God had entrusted him. But he does say that departing and being with Christ is far better.

When a believer in Christ dies, or is dying, the same truth applies. If God grants them healing, they will have more opportunities to serve him. However, if they depart to be with Christ, it's better by far.

If the one who dies is a loved one, we are focused on our personal loss. And I don't mean to downplay this in any way. These feelings of loss are very genuine. However, we must bear in mind the great blessings they'll receive as they enter into Christ's presence. We must bear in mind that these blessings far surpass an extended time in this world, even if they were healthy and strong.

We know that they are entering into a life that will never end. We know they will enjoy eternity in a place where there is no more death or mourning or crying or pain. We know that they are entering into a place where sin and its consequences are a thing of the past.


Even though we will still mourn the loss, and even though feelings of sorrow will persist, this truth grants us great comfort. We know that they are far better off in the presence of Christ. And it's these blessings to which we look forward as we anticipate the end of our own life in this world.

The Mission of the WMF of Prince of Peace is to study and share the Good News of Jesus, through word and deed, at home, in our community and throughout the world.

Summer is speeding right past me. I miss getting together for our WMF Coffee House meetings. We need to schedule one in the near future! It is so wonderful to catch up on what is going on in our lives and to get updates on those out in the mission field. I hope we can get Margie, Sylvia, Jan, Lona, Karen and Kathy to share their adventures form Naknek with us.

I have read about and prayed for **the Wagners**, serving in Sierra Leon. But now some of the family is in Johannesburg because of baby Josiah's bout with pertussis (whooping cough). The care he is receiving in a facility there has been a blessing. It will be awhile before they can go back to Sierra Leone. They are in need of extra funds due to medical and travel expenses.

The Jores in Jinja Uganda are in the process of being deported. This is not in their plans and they are asking us to pray that God will take care of things so that they can continue to work there. It is not a good time to travel as they are expecting a baby in a couple of months. Pray that God gives them clear directions so that His will is done and that the whole family is safe.

These people answering God's call to go to these places that don't know God are often entering into unknown danger. They need to be covered in prayer daily. I know many of you are faithful prayer warriors. But more of us need to take up this command, Myself included. Paul is always asking for prayer as he shares the gospel. And he is a prayer warrior himself.

We have had a couple of impromptu WMF meetings at the DQ this summer. Some business came up that needed to be taken care of and several board members and others were present.

The first thing that needed to be dealt with was preparing and serving the meals for the AFLC west district family Bible camp on June

20. Several ladies signed up to bake some cookies to be used for snacks and coffee breaks. You know who you are...Thanks! A list of items the camp was providing was helpful this year. **For breakfast we decided muffins and fresh fruit** would go with the bread, cereal, and milk and

coffee. Make your own sandwiches was served at noon along with raw veggies and watermelon and cantaloupe. Taco in a bag was the evening meal. Thank you Joan for preparing the taco meat in advance. We got a couple of cases of single serving nacho chips, shredded cheese, and lettuce and just enough chopped tomatoes (thanks Anna). We also got freezer pops and fruit snacks because they are easy. Thanks Nancy for helping be with the daunting task of shopping for this. Jordan and Sarah took breakfast food and snacks Sunday night. I hauled the rest up on Monday. It was a good day with lots of help from wonderful people. I wish I had known how much fun it would have been to attend camp, too.

The other order of business came up out of the blue from some thoughtful, caring people. An individual noticed a lady going through hats at the cancer center in Bismarck. These hats are for anyone who may need a one as they are going through treatment. She wanted to know if she could supply some hats and put tags on the hats with this scripture "May you be strengthened with all power, according to His glorious might, for all endurance and patience with joy." Colossians 1:11and name WMF of Prince of Peace Lutheran Church, Beulah. We okayedthis idea unanimously. Ten hats have already been delivered.

Sign me up to help with kitchen cleaning! And thank you Gina for stepping up and organizing this. It is always more fun working with others on these onus tasks: The kitchens (main, warehouse and old) are greatly in need of some TLC. I realize this is a large project so work days will be scheduled over a period of weeks. Some of the items needing care are the appliances, wiping down cabinets inside/out, conditioning outside of cabinets, decalcifying sinks, ect..... I know that EVERYONE is busy but any amount of time you can spare helping (15 min or even 1/2 hour) will be greatly appreciated and very helpful.:) Again, these areas will be spread out over however many days needed, longest work day will MAYBE be 3 hours.....maybe. 

VBS - We liked the change of 2-1/2 hrs. 6 - 8:30. Easier to manage. Next year we will try to balance the age groups. Had an average of 68 - 70 kids a night. Worked very well having helpers do their craft a head of time. They were able to help more. We spent more money on crafts, but the kids loved them. The team from AFLBS did a fantastic job and with organizing water balloons on last day. We raised over \$700 for FMSC. Ice cream social went very well with parents on the last day.

Shelves for our supply room - We have a budget of \$200 for shelves and maybe some totes. All voted on this and was agreed to purchase the shelves. Angie will look for shelves that will work and will set up a date for us to organize the room.

NEW BUSINESS

- 1. **North Entrance Handrail** Delton Schnaidt brought up installing a plastic railing for the north entrance instead of the rope railing that is currently installed. John Mohl will check on prices.
- 2. **General Cleanup & Organization** (i.e. upstairs storage area, fellowship storage room, water meter storage room). We discussed having a day or two to organize and clean up. Once the back storage rooms are finished and cleaned up, we can begin. This will take many people and some time to complete.
- 3. **Parking Lot** John Mohl said a paving company is in town. We could have them fix the cracks with the rubberized material. Joe Barbot will talk to the pavers that are in town now or the ones who are fixing his driveway. We have congregational approval already from the Annual Meeting to work on the parking lot.
- 4. **Tithe** Our tithe of \$2,234.14 will be given to the AFLC Seminary.
