"And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near."

(Hebrews 10:24-25 ESV)

When we think of the word "church", a certain image comes to mind. For most of us, the image is that of a building. Perhaps it's the image of a sanctuary.

However, the word "church" literally means "assembly." The church is, essentially, the people of God. It's the gathering together of his faithful.

In our day and age, church has little to do with the gathering together of the body of believers. For most of us, it's simply the one hour each week that come for worship. We come to sing the songs, to pray the prayers, and to hear the message. But we don't truly desire to interact with

one another. As soon as the service is over, we're out the door.

Most of us, today, think of the Christian faith as "Jesus and me." We don't think that our faith has anything to do with the church, the people of God. And this contributes to the low priority we place on gathering together.

In one sense, this thinking is correct. Scripture tells us that we're saved by the grace of God through faith in Jesus. We aren't saved by the faith of anyone else. However, that being said, we have been called to make disciples. We've been called to edify the body of Christ. We've even been called to receive ministry from the church. And these are not things we can do by isolating ourselves.

The Christian faith was never meant to be lived alone. As we see in the above passage, we're not to neglect meeting together. We're, instead, to consider how we might stir up one another to love and good works. We're to encourage one another. And we're to do so more and more as we

see the Day, as we see the return of Christ, drawing near.

We're to seek ways that we might build up one another in faith. We're to encourage one another in the expression of our faith. And this isn't merely a one-time thing. It's ongoing. It's something we're to do continually. It's something we're to do more and more.

When understood properly, gathering together with the church should be a priority for us. It shouldn't be done only when we have the time. It should be something so important that we wouldn't miss it.

Throughout the month of June, during our Sunday messages, we're going to look at the life of the early church. We're going to see what they did as they gathered together. We're going to see how they lived life as the body of Christ. And we're going to see why these practices are so important to us.

My hope is that this will be an encouragement to us. My hope is that it will remind us of the importance of sharing our life and faith with one another. And my hope is that we'll stop trying to live out our faith independently but, instead, interdependently with the people of God.





Why We Do What We Do By Jordan Langness

In the past weeks, you have been hearing (at least hopefully) quite a bit on our upcoming Feed My Starving Children Beulah Mobile Pack on August 27th. I hope that just from watching the videos, hearing the stories, or simply being aware of the fact that we are attempting to pack over 100,000 meals is enough to convince you of the worthiness of our efforts, but more than just earthly good, I wanted to make a case why this should be even more important to us.

What reasons, besides the many positives that already exist, should we get behind this effort to provide over 273 children a daily life-sustaining nutritious meal for one year? Even if we take away the good feelings we get by serving in this way, the impact it can have on our community and church, even removing the thoughts of what this could do for the children who receive the food, we are still left with a simple answer; obedience.

It is not difficult to find passages in God's word that point us to the significance of serving others, caring after the orphans and the widows, giving of our resources that we have been entrusted with to Kingdom building efforts, or even how we should treat others in general. What is difficult however to narrow down these references to a few key passages or verses that will fit in the limited space of this newsletter. Since that is the reality, I have compiled a few key verses and thoughts.

In Matthew 25: 31-46 we read of an account where Jesus tells us there will be a day when He returns and separates the sheep from the goats. In this story, He mentions how the sheep continued to bless Him in His moment of need. After hearing this, those who belong to the sheep group ask when they ever saw Him in need and helped Him. In response, Jesus says 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of Mine, you did for Me.' Just think

about that...we have an opportunity with this to be packing meals for Jesus in a very real way!

In the end of Matthew 6, Jesus tells us not to worry about what we will eat or wear. He tells us to instead focus on seeking first His kingdom and His righteousness and then all of these things will be given to us. So how does this promise apply? Well, first off, I don't think any of us are struggling with food issues (the lack of it anyways) to the same degree as the children we are serving. This promise isn't then for us to focus on ourselves, but instead, we get to be a fulfillment of that promise. Through our hands, time, and donations, God can be glorified by His promise being fulfilled through us!

Then there are the greatest commandments. In Matthew 22, Jesus is confronted by a lawyer and asked what the most important commandment was. Jesus responds by saying that the Greatest is to love God...and the second is to love your neighbor as yourself. What is a more clear way for us to love our neighbor than to feed them? Sure, we may never ever meet these people or know how God uses this in their life, but we don't have to.

Finally, there is the simple reality that these children are also made in the image of God. That He knows them. Loves them, wants them to be saved and know Him too. Jesus loved these children enough to die for them; will we love them enough to help feed them? We are not called to fix this problem all on our own; we are called to be obedient, loving, and serve others in Jesus name.
