"So everyone who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven, but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven." (Matthew 10:32-33 ESV)

We live in a time, and in a society, where we're encouraged to keep our faith to ourselves. This is emphasized because we live in a pluralistic society, made up of people from many different belief systems and walks of life. And we're told that it's respectful to allow others to believe what they believe and to live how they want to live.

This resonates with us because, after all, we want the freedom to live out our faith. We want the freedom to hold to our faith without interference from anyone. However, we often fail to realize that this mindset is in direct opposition to the faith we confess.

As believers, we've been called to proclaim the gospel to the whole creation. We've been called to make disciples of all nations. And this isn't something we can do if we keep our mouth shut and our faith to ourselves.

Worse yet, keeping our faith to ourselves means leaving people in their sin. It means leaving them to the consequences of their sin. It means that we desire to receive salvation while leaving them in their condemnation.

Carrying out this call of God requires us to speak up. It necessitates that we share our faith with others, even though they believe differently than us. It requires us to buck the morals of our society in favor of this mission God has entrusted to us.

When we look at a passage, like the one above, it's greatly convicting. I would even say that it's scary. It's convicting and scary because, so often, we've failed to acknowledge Jesus. When given an opportunity to share the gospel, we've kept quiet. And, when facing rejection by men, we've often denied our Lord.

I know this is true of me. Even knowing that I was called by God into the pastoral ministry, I struggled greatly with this in my younger years. I didn't want to come off as too religious because I was afraid of rejection.

Even now, there are occasions when I fail to share my faith as I should. I've had encounters with unbelievers where I've had the chance to speak of Jesus, and I've failed to do so. I've grown so much in this aspect of my life, yet there is so much more room for growth.

As we face this struggle, we must realize that the temptation to keep our mouth shut will only grow as time goes on. It will only grow because, as society turns further and further away from the Lord, the consequences of our outreach will become more and more intense. And, in response, our tendency toward self-preservation will grow stronger and stronger.

The question we must keep in mind is this: Would we rather be received by God and rejected by the world? Or would we rather be received by the world and rejected by God? The Christian life is one of self-denial, not self-preservation.

By seeking to preserve our life in this world, we're rejecting the blessing that God has provided. As Jesus says to us in Matthew 16:24-25: "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it."

Knowing what Christ has done for us, and knowing the blessing he's provided us, let us carry out the call we've been given. May the hope that we possess remove any fear that we feel. And may our hope instill within us a desire that others receive the same blessing, no matter what it means for our life in this world.





Passing on the Faith By Jordan Langness

Last week, we were abundantly blessed to have Pastor Jason Holt come out to our church to teach on passing on the faith to the next generation. Throughout our time together, I was struck by the simplicity of that phrase, but the simultaneous weightiness of it. As a body of believers, this topic should be in the highest echelon of importance to us right behind knowing Jesus ourselves. This should be more important than keeping up the building, more important than "enjoying" the taste of coffee as we sit with one another. Passing on the faith is our very mission in Beulah and beyond.

As we have gathered each night, I have been grateful for each person I saw there. And yet, among this gratitude was a very real since of grief or sadness. Why was there such sadness? To be honest, I was saddened by the reality of how few of our people showed up; especially among the crowd of those who are not grandparents or retired yet. I know that the topic of passing on the faith to the next generation is much much broader than just looking at teens and children, but let's be honest...that is the world I am swimming in right now. The absence of all of these primary faith passers was very alarming to me.

While I have been mulling over the topic of passing on the faith in the past couple of days, there has been a phrase that keeps popping in my head. It is, "We need to be constantly passing on the faith to our students and fellow members because if we don't pass on the faith, they will likely pass on faith." Now to be clear, that final pass on faith means that they will leave it behind...they will treat it as if it isn't that big of a deal. And why may they do that? Well, if we don't take the time and make the effort to actively pass on our faith to

them, our actions are loudly proclaiming that we don't honestly think it is that big of a deal either.

Amidst this gloomy prospect, we must remember that we are not without hope. Jesus reigns as much today as He did nearly 2000 years ago after rising from the dead. The reaching of souls is His work. But we have a role to play too. First and foremost, we need to examine our own hearts and do some reconciling between us and God; confessing our sins, our lack of concern and investment in this area. After dealing with ourselves, we must bring this situation to the Lord in prayer and bathe our minds in the promises of His word. Finally, we must be faithful to pour out ourselves into others. This will be the hardest part of all because it will require some awkwardness and discomfort initially. It will mean intentionally steering conversations past the surface to the spiritual, it will mean being inconvenienced for the sake of someone else so they can be touched by the Gospel, it will mean taking up your cross, dying to yourself, and following Him.

Our mission has been given to us...pass on the faith. It is clear, concise, and easily understood. May each one of us be faithful in sharing Jesus with one another and passing on the amazing reality of God's salvation to all will hear. If not, it will be our silence that gets passed on, and our world cannot afford that right now.



Wednesday Evening Bible Study

The goal of the study is to give us a better understanding of the Islam religion as well as the difference between Islam and Christianity. We are only two weeks into it. The study will go until around the middle of May.

For some movies we would need to pay for showing privileges, but for others, Darcee says we are set to go other than buying the DVD. The deacons seem to like the idea. Bell ringer system is here. Will try to get it operating this summer.

Our furnaces on the roof are giving us problems. The one in fellowship hall is still not working properly. Jordan said the Warehouse furnace sometimes runs all the time and sometimes doesn't heat.

Took down rest of stairway on west side of church. Garner Sailer is going to get some dirt built up there and we'll get some grass growing.

Have to replace a window pane in the fellowship hall.

Altar Outer Arch – Marvin talked to Josh of Infinite Cabinets. Josh said he could not do each piece of the outer arch in one piece because his equipment isn't big enough. He can splice them together if we'd be ok with that. He gave us a bid for \$10,604.75. We voted to go with this bid pending Brad Klipfel agreeing to the design.

Jacob Klaudt will be doing the lawn care. Weed and feed fertilizer would be a good to do this year.

Christian Ed Report – Michelle Klaudt

End of yr SS event - Will be May 22. Michelle will ask if the group going to Alaska wants to use the event as a fundraiser or the youth group can.

SS teacher appreciation gifts - Budget of \$200. Angle is looking into ordering bags with church Logo on it for gifts.

Grad gifts and order cake - 7 grads; 4 boys, 3 girls. Budget of \$125 but this may have been raised. Stephanie will look into what gifts to give.

4th gr. Bibles - One 4th grader this year. Darcee will check if we have any Bibles on hand. If we have to order we will order for next year as well.
