"Oh give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever!" (Psalm 107:1 ESV)

As we come to November, Thanksgiving is what instantly comes to my mind. I think this is true for most of us. We anticipate this day, when we'll stop and offer thanks for all of the blessings we enjoy.

In this spirit, I want to offer my thanks to all of you, for the many gifts given to me during Pastor's Appreciation Month. I'm thankful to serve such a wonderful congregation. And I'm thankful to God for bringing me here.

As Thanksgiving gets closer, we'll be reminded to give thanks by many. We'll see these reminders on TV. We'll hear them on the radio. It will be shared by those who surround us on a daily basis. He provides for us our family, with whom we share life and the responsibilities that come with it. And, of course, he provides for us eternal life.

This is the point in the verse quoted above. And this refrain is repeated throughout the entire psalm. We're reminded to give thanks to the Lord, for his love endures forever. And his love is seen in the blessings he bestows upon us.

So, as we celebrate Thanksgiving, let's make sure that we're properly giving thanks. Let's make sure that we're directing that thanks to the one who has provided each and every one of our blessings. And let us also share with others what God has done for us, that they too might come to know him, to recognize his blessings, and to trust in him for all that they need.

The Mission of the WMF of Prince of Peace is to study and share the Good News of Jesus, through word and deed, at home, in our community and throughout the world.

Thank you, everyone, who came to our last minute WMF Coffee House on Wed, Sept 28.

Mark your calendars: November 7, 7:00 pm, WMF Coffee House will meet. We will be going through the items brought in for the Operation Christmas Child shoe boxes. It is fun to see all the stuff and get it in a manageable order as they will be packed during SS hour on Nov 13. We also can find out if there are some things that may still be needed. Angie W. and Gina F will serve and Darcee will lead devotions. December 5 at 7:00pm we will have our Christmas WMF Coffee House with our election of officers and finish off the 2016 WMF Bible study.

Joan opened the meeting with a devotion by Ron Hutchcraft. He talked about being intentional about introducing people to Jesus like Andrew the disciple was. He answered Jesus's call to follow Him and went and told his brother Peter. Andrew introduced Peter to Jesus and Jesus did the rest. Then Joan prayed.

We didn't have minutes that hadn't been shared before and there was no old business that wasn't really old and finished.

The treasurer's report shows a total of \$3238 and some cents. We chose to support the 1st Choice Clinic Life Walk that was held in Beulah on Oct 8, with our offering collected that morning. We will buy bottled water and granola bars for the participants and give the rest to the Clinic along with \$250 from our mission fund which currently has over \$1300 in it. The mission secretary gave some updates on some of the missionaries: the Raans in Asia are having visa problems and have to come home and apply for different visas; the Jores in Uganda had been struggling with visa issues as well, but praise God that has since been taken care of; the Wagner's are back in Sierra Leon together after the bout with whooping cough; keep all of our missionaries in your prayers. They need to be lifted up daily as they are continually trying to bring the light of Christ to the dark places in the world and they have regular needs to be met as well. Pray for their personal well being and safety for them and their families.

Cradle roll has four new members: Reaiah Langness, Scarlett Schmit, Lizzy Bieri, and Liam Gerde.

Threads of Love Quilters are back to work on Wednesdays. Lots of tops have been stitched together by individuals all year long at home. On Wed the quilts are assembled with batting and backs tied to the beautiful tops. Then the edges are hemmed. Fabric is also sorted and made usable for future tops and backs. More helping hands are always welcome. And The Net up at Naknek can't get enough quilts.

The Community Meals are doing well. If you ever come to the church on the Friday before the second Saturday of the month you will be overwhelmed with the most tantalizing aromas from the meal that will be served that 2nd Sat. These meals are free and everyone is welcome to come eat. The more the merrier and instead of stopping that Saturday project to cook a meal, just bring the hands up for lunch.

Gina Feist has put together a schedule for deep cleaning the kitchen. She is doing a lot of the cleaning herself. We will be buying some items to make the kitchen more efficient. There are items such as the plastic serving trays and bowls that need to be replaced. We are going to get some fatigue mats for the people that stand and prepare food for the community meals and funerals etc. Our kitchen did pass the last inspection so that it is up to code to continue with the Community Meals.

Margie Lee, Sylvia Zeiszler, Cheri Sperry, Leona Brecht and I went to the Fall WMF District Rally at Bethel Free Lutheran in Minot on the 8th of October. It was a most uplifting day for all of us. The theme for the day was "OUT OF DARKNESS, INTO THE LIGHT" with Luke 1:78-79 as the key verse: "Because of the tender mercy of our God, with which the sunrise from on high will visit us. To shine upon those who sit in darkness and the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace." There was wonderful music and inspirational devotionals and Bible study. Starla Liedle, White Earth, ND gave a personal testimony that is only believable because of the awesome God we know and trust in good times and bad. And it was fun to have Margie and Sylvia share with all of us a more detailed and personal account of their time in Naknek. Some business that was taken care of was selecting new officers: Marilyn Wagner is the new President; Margie Lee the new Treasurer, and Jeanie Sheldon took the mission secretary position. An update on the Raans: they have plans to fly back to the US on November 14 and baby's due date is December 19th. Please pray for safe travels and a healthy delivery. Schierkolks are looking for a youth director. Pray pray pray!

Wants By Jordan Langness

"My Father, if it is possible, may this cup be taken from me. Yet not as I will, but as you will." -Jesus as quoted in Matthew 26:39

Every day our lives are filled with choices. Some choices carry a great weight of significance to them as the outcome of that particular choice will send ripple effects throughout one's life for years to come. At the same time, other choices seem so small and insignificant such as which pair of socks you chose to wear today. We make many of these decisions subconsciously throughout the day, but one thing that tends to unite our choices into a cohesive pattern is how they impact us personally; our comfort, convenience, cash, and so on. We are so assimilated into this pattern that often times our choices seem to be done on auto pilot.

Despite the convenience of auto pilot, traveling in this mode can be quite dangerous. If you are off course you will drift without knowing it into potentially hazardous territory. Morally, apathy may seem like a friend, but it leads people to toxic places. We begin to feel that we are what life is all about, that we are entitled to have our wants and desires met. Don't believe me? Let me ask a few evaluating questions to see if entitlement is a struggle in your life. First, do you expect presents on your birthday, Christmas, or other holidays/anniversaries? If so, why? Why do you deserve to get a gift from someone else? Next, do you expect your church to do things your way...to play the music you like, offer the programs and activities you like, have the atmosphere you like? Again, why? Why should the church cater to your wants?

Contrasting this spirit of entitlement then is a beautifully challenging example given to us by Jesus Christ in the garden of Gethsemane. Facing the most challenging moment of His entire eternal existence, Jesus asks the Father for a way out of the cross, but immediately after that request, He surrenders His will to do what the Father desired. As believers, this pattern should be what marks our lives and will lead to God's church being filled with something totally other than what is available in the world. What would happen if you went through your day consistently asking yourself if what you are about to do is based off of what you want or what God wants? Before watching that movie, planning that trip, or walking past a stranger in need, ask yourself if your course of action is being set based off of your comfort or His commands. It is challenging, I know, but it leads to something beautiful; it leads to people seeing your good works and glorifying your Father in Heaven because of them.
