"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." (Matthew 28:19-20 ESV)

This month, Prince of Peace will be hosting Pastor Jim Rasmussen, the Director of Evangelism for the AFLC. He will be sharing at our fall Spiritual Life Meetings, teaching us about the life of the believer. And he'll focus on the fact that, as believers, our lives revolve around making disciples.

Most of us are aware that we've been called by Jesus to reach out to unbelievers. We know that we've been called to proclaim to them the gospel. However, when we think about how to do this, we've become fixated on certain methods that are, in reality, too short-sighted.

We've grown up in a culture of crusades and tracts. When we think of evangelism, we think of gospel messages followed by an altar call. We think of sharing booklets, like the Four Spiritual Laws, with unbelievers. And we seem to think that, once we've done this, we've fulfilled our duty.

We are called to share the gospel. And the approaches I mentioned can be helpful at times. However, we fail to realize that outreach is much more relational.

We're called, in the above passage, to make disciples of all nations. And, although we must share the gospel with them if we're to do this, making disciples is much more involved. It's a long-term commitment that involves building relationships with others.

We make disciples of others by sharing the gospel and baptizing. But we also do so by teaching them to observe all that Christ has commanded. And, when we consider that statement, I think we realize that this isn't something that's done overnight.

We recognize that we've grown in our faith over time. As we've been instructed in God's Word, we've gradually turned from our sin and trusted in Christ in greater ways. And the same principle plays out in the lives of others.

As people come to know us, and as they come to see our love for them, we gain opportunities to speak into their life. We gain opportunities to share God's Word with them. And, as this progresses, the Lord is able to draw them to a life of repentance and faith.

This is where most of us tend to fall short. I know it's an area where I have a lot of room for improvement. As I look at my life and ministry, I see that my wife is much better at this than I am. While I do well in a church setting, she is much better at building friendships with unbelievers. And this gives her unique opportunities to minister to them over time.

I encourage you to attend our Spiritual Life Meetings to learn more about this. And, as we do so, may the Lord use us to reach out to our community. May the Lord use us to make disciples of Jesus.

I am Nothing By Jordan Langness

"What then is Apollos? And what is Paul? Servants through whom you believed, even as the Lord gave opportunity to each one. I planted, Apollos watered, but God was causing the growth. So then neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but God who causes the growth. Now he who plants and he who waters are one; but each will receive his own reward according to his own labor. For we are God's fellow workers; you are God's field, God's building." -1

Corinthians 3:5-9

Apostle Paul was a pretty significant guy. Being the author of a majority of the New Testament, Paul's life and teaching has impacted literally millions of people....probably up in the Billions given the generations that have lived since the time that he wrote those words. We on the other hand may tend to feel not so important. In the game of comparison that we like to play so often, Paul definitely tops each one of us. But, in reality, Paul had a much better perspective on himself and his work...he was nothing.

Looking in the verses above, Paul makes reference to his work alongside another significant figure in the early church named Apollos. It is believed that Paul was writing to correct some early distortion of the truth by groups who thought they were more important than others because they were connected directly to Paul or Apollos. In response, Paul points out the fact that he was just the person who plants seeds or waters the garden. His role is not consequential compared to that of the One who actually causes things to grow.

Many of us may be tempted to argue Paul's point and try to convince him that he truly was a significant person in the history of humanity, but to do so would miss his point. Paul, led by the Spirit, humbly admitted that the focal point should be Christ, not on His

workers. After all, any gains to His Kingdom belong to Him regardless of the people or the methods that He uses.

One of the reasons I say this is as a way to prepare our minds for the upcoming changes that will be upon us in the next few months. I know that we don't like change by and large, but despite our wishes, change is coming. Over the past weeks, I have heard people share that there will be large shoes to fill once we leave, that I have done a great job, and that the ministry in our community just won't be the same. However, the truth of the matter is that, like Paul, I am nothing. I do not have anything unique to give, nothing extraordinarily special to offer, and in and of myself, not much of value to contribute. What I do have is Christ...which is the same thing that hopefully the rest of our congregation has as well.

All this being said, God has been faithful in working through and despite me in both our congregation and community. He is the One who changes hearts and lives, and He can do the same through you as well. My encouragement to you who get to stay in Beulah is this...there is much work to be done, and you are the people that the Lord is seeking to use to accomplish it. Each one of us may feel inadequate, but that is right where the Lord wants us. When we are face to face with our inadequacy, we are in a place to humbly seek the Lord which is when God can use us best. Even though it is tough to remember, Paul also points us to another important truth essential for our individual callings...and that is that God is who does the work of making fruit.

Ultimately, it isn't about you and it isn't about me, it is about Jesus Christ and the work that He seeks to do through each one of us. Has He called you to be a planter, to water, or maybe even to reap? Whatever He has called you to do, I pray that you would be faithfully obedient, trusting in Him to do the work, and that you would be blessed to be able to see God working through your life.

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

President's Report - Delton Schnaidt

From Paul's 1st letter to the Corinthians in chapter 12:

¹² Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ. ¹³ For we were all baptized by one Spirit so as to form one body—whether Jews or Gentiles, slave or free—and we were all given the one Spirit to drink. ¹⁴ Even so the body is not made up of one part but of many. ²⁷ Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it. ²⁸ And God has placed in the church first of all apostles, second prophets, third teachers, then miracles, then gifts of healing, of helping, and of different kinds of tongues.

The part of these passages that stand out most to me at this time are the words found in verse (28), which applies to the greater majority of the congregation. I'm referring to the words "teaching', and "of helping". These are 2 areas where we often fall short, yet most of us would fall in the category of teaching and helping. Members who are willing to teach Sunday School, or to commit to a term on church council are most often the most difficult to find. There seems to be a serious reluctance to these commitments that I cannot understand. As the passage states, as a congregation, we are "one" body with many parts. We have many members and we need each and every member to be active to effectively accomplish the ministry and the work at Prince of Peace. That being said, the annual meeting of Prince of Peace is just around the corner, and the nominating committee once again has a challenging task ahead of them to find willing members to have their name included on a ballot, as a possibility to fill one of the vacant committee member positions.

Pastor's Report - Pastor Kent

Our Wednesday night Bible study has resumed looking at the book of Daniel.
