"Have I any pleasure in the death of the wicked, declares the Lord GOD, and not rather that he should turn from his way and live?" (Ezekiel 18:23 ESV)

January is a month that has been recognized as Sanctity of Life Month. The 21st of January will be Sanctity of Life Sunday. It's a time to remember that, because it was created by God, all human life is sacred.

Our focus, during this time of year, is typically on abortion. And it's needless to say that this practice is a terrible evil. However, the scope of this remembrance goes much further. It speaks to issues such as euthanasia, physician assisted suicide, invitro fertilization, living wills, contraception, and more. One of the primary things we must remember, when it comes to life issues, is that God is the giver of life. Life flows from him. And life has value because of him.

We remember from the creation account that God formed man and breathed into him the breath of life. We're told also, in John 1, that life is in the Word, that it's in Jesus. And we find in Scripture that, not only did God provide for us life in this world. He's also provided for us eternal life. Through Jesus he's enabled us to live not only for eighty, ninety, or even one hundred years. He's enabled us to live forever.

Even though he is just, even though he issued the punishment of death upon man in response to our sin, and even though he's decreed the punishment of hell for those who do not receive salvation, he doesn't take pleasure in this. He is not a sadistic God who celebrates as the wicked receive their due. As we see in the above passage, it's his desire that the wicked should turn from his way and live. It's God's desire that all should live. It's his desire that all should live forever. And, for this reason, he's made eternal life available for everyone. Jesus' death served as the atoning sacrifice for the lives of not only a few, but for all.

This great blessing is available to all people through faith in him. By trusting in Jesus, by trusting in his sacrifice, we're enabled to receive salvation. And we are called to take this message to the world around us.

Seeing that God desires life for all, we should share this desire. We should desire that people would gratefully receive the blessing of life in this world, and that it would not be denied them. And we should also desire that all people will receive the blessing of eternal life. It should be our desire that, through faith in Jesus, they will receive salvation from sin and death.

"And now let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds" —Hebrews 10:24

Just the other day, Sarah, the kids and I were able to visit some friends one evening. We intended to just drop by for a short period of time, see how everyone was doing, and so on, but the visit ended up being a bit longer than was planned. Time seemed to fly by and the fellowship, although it was still fairly short, was very sweet. That night, as we were gathering things for supper together, we reflected on how we wished we had done visits like that more often. We maybe have held on to our schedule and routine a bit too tightly; it is a lesson that we needed to learn and will need to be reminded of again I am sure.

Hebrews 10:24 has an interesting word choice in the NIV...to "spur" one another on. This makes me think of the wild west imagery of the back of a cowboy boot...those things probably hurt! In this translation, it seems that we are to encourage this behavior in a very serious manner...it isn't just a kind word...but there is force behind the encouragement. In the ESV, the imagery given is to consider how we can "stir up" one another. I don't get the same western imagery in this translation (That isn't the correct spelling of stirrup anyways) but it is still powerful. You can stir up a crowd into a frenzy...it is a building up of tension and intent. The NASB uses the word "stimulate" for how we are to encourage one another...but the end result in all these translations is the same... love and good works.

Given my recent experience in regretting what was not done while I still had the chance to do it here and the passage to encourage each other on to love and good deeds, consider this my spurring, stimulating, and stirring up. But before I get into some of the items on what we can do, I want to acknowledge the many things that are being done. It has been a great blessing to see the way that this congregation has stepped into several ministries like the community meals, quilting, and the mobile packs. There is a lot that is happening here that isn't seen on Sunday morning including Bible studies and different growth opportunities. There is genuine life here as well as a heart for service...which are both great!

While these elements do exist, I am still left to wonder is this the best we can do? Now, this is in no way an attempt to minimalize the good things that are already here, but simply something to spur us on, to encourage us to evaluate our impact in very significant areas.

First and foremost, are we doing our best at loving the Lord Jesus Christ? This whole question must be started with the acknowledgment that each and every drop of our love for Him must also come from Him...so I am not trying to get us to work up some love for Him or expression of that love from our flesh...that doesn't work. What I am saying is that are we doing everything for His glory? Are we truly giving Him our best? Are we putting our best effort into the worship service...are we making our best effort to come to Bible studies, corporate prayer times, special meetings, and other opportunities for us to grow in our knowledge of and love for the Lord? Is our love for Jesus something that we are known for in our community or does it take second place to something else?

Secondly, are we doing everything that we can do to love our neighbor? The biggest thing that we can do for them is pray for them and regularly give them opportunities to know Jesus. Are we doing these things? What about meeting the needs of people in our community? Again, there are things that are being done, and there are many people who are giving their all in these two categories...but there is also a lot to be done and many people who haven't guite got their skin in the game yet. Consider the basket that we have set out for donating items for our local food bank at WARC. With a congregation of this size, we should be able to at the very least fill that basket every week (it is a small basket). Is it too much to think that a church our size can provide enough food to meet just one(at the least) hungry family's needs? What about serving each other at church? There are many needs within our own congregation that exist...needs for someone to just sit and talk with to needs with yard work or house projects.

Third, what about our outflow? When Pastor Jim Rasmussen was here, he brought up the concept of spiritual constipation...where you keep being fed but you have no outlet. Constipation is not a good thing...and for another natural reference, consider the dead sea. The dead sea has fresh water flowing into it, but since it has no outlet, there is no life. We don't think about how this can be a danger for us spiritually, but it truly can. What is your outflow...how are you serving and sharing the Gospel. I am giving this challenge specifically to all of my students. Guys, you are living in a time where it is assumed that you are there to consume information and grow...but you are also called on to give. How are you serving Jesus...where are you sharing what you have been learning about Jesus? What avenues have yet to be explored? Could you start a Bible study at school...a small group with your friends, help lead a group that is already existing or helping out with younger Sunday School students here? There are so many ways for you to share!

I know that we will not solve all of the world's problems ourselves...after all Jesus Himself said that we will always have the poor. I also don't want this to come across as a statement that proclaims that if we do these things we will go to heaven. We can never do enough for that. What I am saying though is that our lives are to be marked by the fruit of God's presence and work in us. We are to love one another in such a way that that love points people to Jesus. Not only that, but we are called to stir up the desire in one another to live lives of love and good deeds.

Thank you for the many ways that you have encouraged me to live in this way over the past nine years at Prince of Peace. You all will be greatly missed, but I look forward to the times when the Lord allows us to come back and hear about the love and good works that have been stirred up in your midst. Live in His peace, presence, and plan.

Recruitment for teachers next year will be a group effort. SS takes a lot of work and we don't want Angie to get burned out. Angie will check with KRCC about visiting next spring.

Organist Pay – Council is looking at organist pay for Sunday services, prelude and evening services.

Valentines Banquet – Les & Joette Buchmann are heading up a Valentine's Banquet. More info to follow.

Christmas Gifts – Council voted to give gift cards to Pastor Kent, Darcee Wenning and Renee Mozga. Jordan will be given cash since he will be moving at the end of the month.

Jordan's Resignation – Jordan will have used up all his vacation days by December 27 or 28 (his intended departure date). We will pay him through the end of the month.

Tithe - \$2,000 will be given to AFLC All Ministries and \$455.34 to given to our Community Meal Fund.
