Pastor Kent

"Now when they heard this they were cut to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?" And Peter said to them, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit."" (Acts 2:37-38 ESV)

The season of Lent, in the church, begins on Ash Wednesday. However, for some, it is preceded by another celebration. It's preceded by Fat Tuesday.

Fat Tuesday is also known as Mardis Gras Day, or Shrove Day. The idea is that, on Fat Tuesday, you can eat as much as you want of anything that you want before you begin your Lenten fast.

The biggest celebration of Fat Tuesday is in New Orleans on Bourbon Street. And it's a day of more than just eating whatever you want. It's a big

drunken party where sin and decadence are enjoyed and celebrated.

I find this interesting. In short, the mentality is that we can enjoy our sin today before we give it up tomorrow. We can enjoy our sin now because God will forgive us tomorrow.

Most of us don't go to this extreme. However, a similar attitude is often found in our heart. We often give in to sin, knowingly and willingly. And we excuse our behavior with the fact that God will forgive us.

While it's true that God will forgive us of our sin, this attitude, this mindset, completely contradicts the gospel. When we come to faith in Christ, we are called to repentance. We are called to turn from our sin and to seek God's mercy.

We see this in the above passage. After hearing Peter proclaim the Word to them, the people asked what they should do. He, then, told them to repent and be baptized for the forgiveness of sin.

We are called to repent, we are called to turn from our sin, because God is saving us from sin. And, if he's saving us from sin, we cannot remain in it. We cannot continue to be willfully enslaved to sin and, at the same time, be saved from it.

I'm not suggesting that we can live a life free of sin. However, from our repentance flows a hatred of our sin. From our repentance flows a desire to turn from our sin and to live for the Lord.

A repentant spirit is not something that we can turn off for a moment of "fun." We must not gladly sin, reassuring ourselves that we'll repent tomorrow. Repentance is a crucial aspect of our faith and salvation.

Matthew 26:41 tells us, "Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak." If this is the case, why do we as Christians put ourselves in situations where we may compromise our spirit? Why do we go out of our way to test ourselves to see how close we can get to sinning without actually crossing the threshold?

If you are a middle school girl and you spend time with people that only gossip and break down other people to build themselves up, you tell yourself, "It's ok, I don't take part in all that is said, I just listen. And if I make a good enough impression maybe I can change the hearts of the people in that group from the inside."

Or maybe you are a male sophomore in college looking at things you know you shouldn't be on your laptop after everyone else is asleep. You might tell yourself, "It's ok, this is healthy. Everyone around me is doing this and they all seem to be doing just fine, no one else is affected by this."

Or a 37 year old mom meeting other wives for coffee and talking about their husbands in ways that if, their husbands heard them, their pride would be chopped down for years to come because no matter what, a good husbands pride comes straight from his better half. And you think, "Well, maybe I shouldn't say these things about my husband, but he's not here and everyone else has dirt on their husband so I add something so I don't come off as too 'goody-goody'."

And lastly, maybe you're a happily married husband with two children but no matter what, you can't stop wishing you were single again. It's not often, but when you go on facebook and see that your college buddies are out having fun and tearing up the town, you'd be lying if you said you didn't wish that was you. But this is the road you chose, and you tell yourself, "I'm happy, and I'll never leave my family, so I'll just fantasize about what I could be doing with those that don't have the 'baggage' that I do."

We all have temptations in this world that the enemy would love us to fall into and worse, justify to ourselves and God. So how do we avoid these situations that cause us to fall spiritually and grow further away from where God wants us? The answer is simple, yet seemingly impossible. This solution is, "preparation". 1 Peter 1:13 says, "Therefore, preparing your minds for action, and being sober-minded, set your hope fully on the grace that will be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ." The only way to avoid the sinful things that we struggle with in this world is to prepare for them beforehand. This is what we mean when we say that serving God is a battle. You prepare for battle in the same way, thoughtfully. Before the middle school girl goes to recess, she must think, "Maybe I shouldn't surround myself with those that bring others down." The young man in college must think, "Perhaps these actions not only are hurting my relationship with God now, but they also will devastate all of my future relationships if not stopped." The mom and wife must realize, "I am my husband's cornerstone on

this Earth and my first devotion is to God and directly after that it is to the one that I vowed for better or worse until I see my Father in Heaven." Lastly the Father and husband must come to the conclusion that he is blessed, and this is the life not only the he has chosen, but this is the life that God has gifted him is God's unending Grace. How could he want for anything else with all that he has been blessed.

If we decide to avoid these situations while they are happening, we will always find that we are not strong enough to say no. We must learn to say 'no' before the situation even happens. All of these characters must find ways to prepare, defend against, or avoid situations that would hurt themselves, the ones they love, or their Father in Heaven, just as we must with our temptations.
