"...what you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses entrust to faithful men who will be able to teach others also."

(2 Timothy 2:2 ESV)

In Matthew 28, Jesus said to his followers: *"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."*

This is a passage that we refer to as the Great Commission. And, as we think about the Great Commission, we tend to focus on baptism. Yet, even though baptism is immensely important and I'm not trying to downplay it in any way, there's another aspect of this passage that we tend to miss.

In this passage, Jesus is calling us to make disciples. And he's calling us to do so by going, baptizing, and teaching. Baptism, then, is an essential aspect of making disciples, but so too is teaching. We've been called by Jesus to teach others to observe all that he's commanded us.

Paul, in the above passage, says something similar. As he's giving instructions to the young pastor Timothy, he tells him to entrust to others what he had learned from Paul. And he was to do so that they, in turn, might pass it along to others.

In the same way, as disciples of Jesus, we are always learning and growing. We are continually receiving instruction from the Word of God. And this instruction comes to us in many different ways.

We receive it, primarily, in the church. We receive it as we gather together for worship, where the Word is preached. We also receive it in Bible studies and Sunday School. We receive it in our own devotional time, as we read God's Word for ourselves. We receive it as we read other Christian books or listen to other Christian teachers.

There's no denying that this is a great benefit in our own life. We receive conviction in areas where we're falling short. We're driven to repentance and confession. We receive the grace of God, as we look to the gospel in faith. And it causes us to look to the Lord for the strength we need to live in his calling.

Yet, so often, this is the end all when it comes to our lives. We believe that God's Word is there to benefit us, to provide us with God's blessing, and that's the end of it. We receive God's Word, and we relish his Word. But we fail to do anything more with it. We fail to realize our further calling.

We are called to take what's been entrusted to us and entrust it to others. We are to receive the blessing God's Word offers us, and extend that to others. And there are so many natural relationships where we are able to do this.

We're able to do so, first and foremost, among our own family. We are able to do so among our friends and acquaintances. We're able to do so among our coworkers. We're able to do so among our neighbors.

I realize that many of us feel odd trying to pass along the blessings of God's Word. We don't feel called or equipped to be teachers. And we envision this as a formal Bible study that we're conducting with others.

It certainly could be a formal Bible study. It could be an intentional time of mentoring someone else. But it doesn't have to be as formal as we envision it to be.

We can share encouragement from God's Word as we interact with one another, or as we share our struggles with one another. We can send a card or a note of encouragement to someone who is struggling or facing a new phase of life. We can share as we engage in natural conversation with those who surround us on a day to day basis.

This is what it means to make disciples. We take the Word, which has been given to us, and share it with others. We do so that they might receive it, and share it with still more. We entrust to others what we've received that they might teach others also.

To the Jews who had believed Him, Jesus said, "If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." (John 8 vs. 31,32)

Wow! I can't say how many times I've heard this phrase misquoted, but it's been quite a few. When I've heard the phrase misquoted, it always left out the first words from scripture, which are the "qualifying words" to the second part of the phrase. The most important words in this phrase is "If you hold to my teaching" "Then you will know the truth." The passage is simply stating that for us to begin to know the truth, we need to hold to the teaching of Jesus. No other way – Period. One powerful 2 letter word precedes the entire message. The word - - "IF". That is the qualifier for the rest of the message. The next most important 4 letter word is "THEN".

I think you get the point. As Christians, we seem to think we're doing okay when we think back about

all the good, we've done and all the good we are doing. Yet, gets us every time, when we realize it or not, that we fall short of holding to Jesus' teaching from time to time. If we're honest with ourselves, we must admit that we probably fail in this more often than not when our circumstances are challenged.

If I was a ministry doctor with a cure to the epidemic of failing to hold to Jesus' teaching, I would prescribe to my patient..... repent regularly, be in prayer regularly for forgiveness, for understanding, for obedience, and for strength to overcome the devil's temptations when we are tempted to not hold to the teachings of Jesus. Jesus has proven that He is more powerful than the devil when He defeated death and rose from the dead.

As we approach and celebrate Holy week this year, may we be mindful of the sacrifice that Jesus made in our behalf for the forgiveness of our sins, and a life of salvation everlasting. I pray that He gives each one of us the strength to hold to His teaching, and that we can claim without a doubt, to be His disciples who know the truth which sets each one of us free.
