"But thanks be to God, that you who were once slaves of sin have become obedient from the heart to the standard of teaching to which you

were committed, and, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness."

(Romans 6:17-18 ESV)

As we approach the 4th of July, our thoughts revolve around the concept of freedom. This, after all, is what America stands for. And this, of course, is something we all long for. We want to be free to live our own life, without the authorities that be telling us what to do. We want to be free to make our own decisions, without the powers that be making them for us.

This is true also when it comes to our relationship with God. We tend to think of ourselves as free. And we tend to think that God has given us free will.

He has given us free will, in a sense. He doesn't tell us if we should marry nor whom we should marry. He doesn't tell us what to eat or what to wear (other than the fact that it should be modest). He doesn't tell us whether we should own a dog, a cat, or no pet at all. Decisions like these are left to us.

However, in a very real sense, we are not free in the least. Before coming to faith in Christ, we are slaves to sin. Sin is our master. The only thing we can do is sin. No matter how hard we try, we cannot live for the Lord and we cannot obey him.

After coming to faith in Christ, we are free from sin. I don't mean by this that we're perfect or that we no longer struggle with sin. However, because of Jesus, it doesn't have the hold on us that it once did.

But this doesn't mean we're free. We still aren't free to live life as we choose. We still aren't free to make any and every decision for ourselves. We aren't free because, after coming to faith, we are slaves of righteousness.

After coming to faith in Christ, righteousness is our master. After coming to faith in Christ, it's righteousness that controls us. After coming to faith in Christ, we desire to live for the Lord and we strive to do so in all things.

This is what Paul is revealing to us in the above passage. And even though we tend to think of slavery in a negative way, even though the very term puts us off, in this sense it is good. It's good because, as slaves of righteousness, we receive the benefits of righteousness.

As he goes on to say, in verses 20-22: "For when you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. But what fruit were you getting at that time from the things of which you are now ashamed? For the end of those things is death. But now that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves of God, the fruit you get leads to sanctification and its end, eternal life."



Our Undeniable Enemy: Thanos

1st Corinthians 15:24-26 (ESV) 24 Then comes the end, when he delivers the kingdom to God the Father after destroying every rule and every authority and power. 25 For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. 26 The last enemy to be destroyed is death.

Isaiah 25:8-9 (ESV) 8 He will swallow up death forever; and the Lord God will wipe away tears from all faces, and the reproach of his people he will take away from all the earth, for the Lord has spoken. 9 It will be said on that day, "Behold, this is our God; we have waited for him, that he might save us. This is the Lord; we have waited for him; let us be glad and rejoice in his salvation."

I enjoyed VBS this week and the many opportunities it gave me to hang out with the kids, and I got to be a part of a bunch of conversations I wouldn't otherwise have been privy to.

One of our conversations was comical. Literally, it was about the Marvel comic arch-vilian Thanos, and the Avengers movies he stars in. The only problem for me was, I haven't seen any of the Marvel movies (except for maybe Thor, which is as old as many of the kids I was talking with), and so I had nothing to contribute. Finally during a lull in the banter I said "ya'll know Thanos is the Greek word for death right?"

"What? Is that true?"

"Yeah. Totally. Thanos is the Greek word for death."

Dramatic pause for mental processing...

"Awesome"

We all know that we live in a world of conflicts and struggles, yet sometimes we struggle just to figure out who or what our enemies are. Except death. That one we get. Everyone knows and understands that death is not good. Sometimes, when our view of reality gets really skewed, death might start to

look like a useful ally, but even then, even when we've fallen victim to the lies that would paint death as something we can exploit for our own purposes, we still know that death is not good. Death is our undeniable enemy.

This universal knowledge that death is our enemy is why we love myths like the Marvel comics. Even when the stories are entirely fantastical, when the battlefields span the entire cosmos and laws of reality seem to be suspended, the one law in every comic that isn't suspended is that death is the enemy. We can identify with that struggle. We have the same enemy and the same problem as the characters in our myths: death. That's why when you tell an Avengers fan, "yeah Thanos is the Greek word for death" it blows their mind, because it confirms something they already suspected: this myth is dealing with the same problem I am. This is why we humankind loves myths. No matter how crazy the storyline, we're still able to identify with the main problem.

But the other reason we love myths is because we naturally believe that if we can identify with the problems they pose, we probably can identify with their solutions as well. This is where truth and myth part company.

Our problem is not just that death is a powerful enemy. Our problem is that death is an unconquerable enemy (for us). Mankind's desire to be the hero of our own story constantly rises as the theme of our myths, but this desire is a futile and even illogical one. When we try to be our own heroes, what we're really saying is: "I cannot evade or conquer death; therefore I should try really hard to evade and conquer death." It doesn't make much sense on paper, and its incredibly frustrating and despair inducing in practice.

Here's where the joy and hope of truth stands beautifully opposed to the despair of myth. Death is our undeniable enemy, but Jesus Christ is our undeniable Lord and Savior who conquered, destroyed, and swallowed up death for us. When we place our faith in Him, Jesus is the serpent head-crushing, death destroying, life giving hero of our story. That story, because its our story, yours and mine, is more awesome than even the wildest comic.




