"For if you forgive others their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you, but if you do not forgive others their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses."
(Matthew 6:14-15 ESV)

Immediately prior to the words spoken above, Jesus had taught to his disciples the prayer we know as the Lord's Prayer. In this prayer, he told them to pray: "...forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors." Then, after concluding the prayer, he further explained this petition.

As it's the only petition he went on to explain in greater detail, this tells us how important it is. As believers, as a people who've been forgiven, we are called upon to forgive others. In fact, we are required to do so.

We have to be careful with this statement, that we are required to do so. Forgiving others is not a

work by which we merit salvation. However, the fruit of our own forgiveness, the necessary result of the forgiveness granted us by God, is our forgiveness of others.

In fact, if we fail to forgive others, we will not be forgiven. If we don't extend to others the forgiveness that God has given us, we will not be forgiven. So this, you see, is a matter of grave consequence.

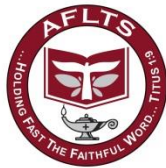
This is also an area where many of us tend to struggle. Although we long desperately for the grace and mercy of God, we are not willing to extend that grace to others. We feel that, instead of granting them forgiveness as an act of grace, they have to become deserving of our forgiveness.

We rationalize this behavior by saying we will not allow others to walk all over us. We rationalize this behavior by saying we have too much self-respect to allow others to treat us poorly. We tell ourselves that, when people wrong us repeatedly, forgiveness is no longer required.

This reveals that we don't truly understand the gospel. It reveals to us that we don't truly understand the magnitude of our sin. Understanding the gospel, and believing the gospel, will naturally cause us to extend forgiveness as an act of grace.

The gospel tells us that, because of our sin, we are completely undeserving of God's blessings. The gospel tells us that God has granted us forgiveness even though we don't deserve it. The gospel tells us that he's granted us forgiveness even though we can in no way make it up to him. The gospel tells us that, because of Jesus' sacrifice, God looks upon us as if we haven't sinned.

It's this grace that we're called upon to extend to others. As we've been forgiven, we are to forgive. We are called to give grace to those who are undeserving, and to those who have wronged us repeatedly. We are to look upon those who have wronged us as if they haven't done so.

1 Timothy 2:1-6 (ESV) First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, ²for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way. ³This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Savior, ⁴who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. ⁵For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus, ⁶who gave himself as a ransom for all, which is the testimony given at the proper time.

I've started working on our men's study for October, which is going to be on original sin, and so I've been doing some reading from various teachers on why God allowed Adam and Eve to transgress

His commandment to them. Ultimately, this problem bumps up against the question of why God allows anything evil in the world to happen or to exist.

Many philosophers throughout history have made the answer to that question easier than it really is by simply saying God made people sinful as an exercise of his sovereign will.

That idea makes God the author of sin and thus boldly contradicts scripture. God's desire and will is for all men and women to be introduced to their Savior and King Jesus Christ, and thereby be saved. When Scripture says that Christ paid the ransom for all, it proclaims that Christ has made satisfaction for all sins and sinners. In the final judgement, the only sins left unforgiven will be the sins that were not, by faith, given to Christ. Everyone who places their faith in the grace of Jesus Christ has their sins imputed to Christ, as is God's desire.

In life, we will often see or encounter evil that we will struggle to forgive, yet Christ would have us pray for the salvation of both the people being tormented by evil, as well as the tormentors. In our own strength, we will never be able to lay down our swords and forgive evil. But Christ has beaten evil already through His atoning sacrifice. So we can pray for our lost leaders and our unbelieving neighbors, even when we 100% disagree with what they stand for. There is grace enough for their repentance and salvation, just as there is for ours. It is God's desire that they be saved, and it is well pleasing to God when it's our desire as well.

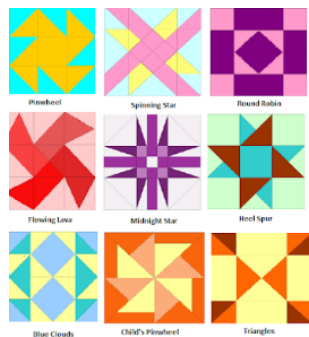

Youth Shepherds

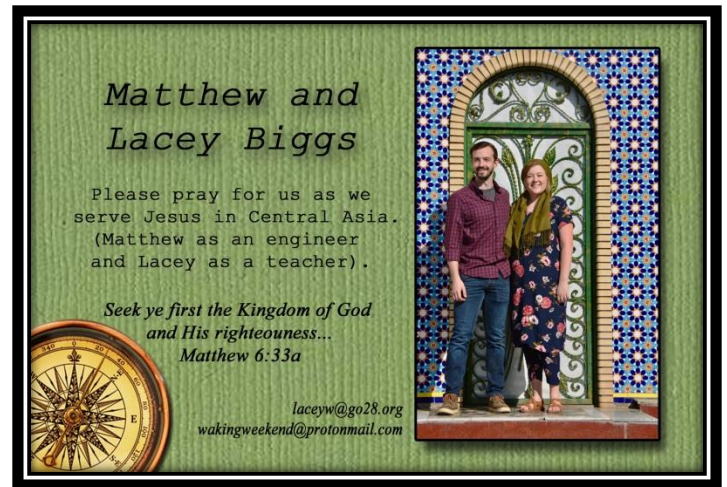
She speaks with wisdom, and faithful instruction is on her tongue (Proverbs 31:26)
