"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up

what is planted; a time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up; a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance; a time to cast away stones, and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing; a time to seek, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to cast away; a time to tear, and a time to sew; a time to keep silence, and a time to speak; a time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace." (Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 ESV)

With the new year upon us, one of the things that we naturally consider is time. We often note how quickly the time passes. We note that, the older we get, the faster time seems to go. And, for this reason, we are bent on managing our time well. We're consumed with controlling the time that we have.

The passage, above, is a familiar one for most of us. It's familiar because we often hear it read at funerals. It's often chosen because of its reference to death and a time to die. But, at the very least, we know this passage from the famous song by the Byrds, *Turn, Turn, Turn.*

The point of this passage, however, is something we need desperately to take to heart. It's something we tend to miss. But it's something we see clearly as we stop and consider the individual phrases being used.

There is a time to be born and a time to die. Yet, both of these times are outside of our control. We have no choice in the time of our birth. We have no choice in birth itself. And, in the same way, we have no control over death. There is a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted. But, again, both of these times are outside of our control. Farmers plant when the time is right, when the conditions are right. And they harvest when the proper time comes.

There is a time to kill and a time to heal. Now killing, of course, is not something we should desire. But there are times when it's necessary. Perhaps it's when we must engage in a just war. Perhaps it's when government authorities are punishing a doer of evil. Or perhaps it's when our home is violated and our loved ones are threatened. These circumstances are outside of our control, but they do come. And, in the same way, so do opportunities to heal.

We can go through these verses line by line and see the same truth. There are times and seasons of life that come upon us. And they are outside of our control. They are ordained, they are determined, by God alone.

We must recognize this fact. We must recognize that we can do nothing to alter the times and seasons. And, for this reason, we must stop fighting them.

We must recognize that the only thing we can do is act when it's appropriate. The only thing we can do is respond to the season in the appropriate way. We can plant when it's time to plant. We can mourn when it's time to mourn. We can keep silence when it's time to do so, and speak when it's appropriate.

Many of us struggle with our desire to control. But when we receive this Word, when we take it to heart, it's quite liberating. It's liberating as we recognize our limits, as we recognize and submit to the will of God, and act in the appropriate way at the appropriate time.

Matthew 8:28-34 (ESV) 28

And when he came to the other side, to the country of the Gadarenes, two demon-possessed men met him, coming out of the tombs, so fierce that no one could pass that way. 29 And behold, they cried out, "What have you to do with us. O Son of God? Have vou come here to torment us before the time?" 30 *Now a herd of many pigs was feeding at some* distance from them. 31 And the demons begged him, saying, "If you cast us out, send us away into the herd of pigs." 32 And he said to them, "Go." So they came out and went into the pigs, and behold, the whole herd rushed down the steep bank into the sea and drowned in the waters. 33 The herdsmen fled, and going into the city they told everything, especially what had happened to the demonpossessed men. 34 And behold, all the city came out to meet Jesus, and when they saw him, they begged him to leave their region.

It's funny how we react when we face the untamable nature of God. No one really wants to have two crazy demoniacs outside of their town, so the fact that Jesus healed them should have been cause for celebration in this town. Instead, they begged Jesus to depart from them. So it is, also, with the Gospel. It seems like it's very hard for people to change. Even when the problems they face are glaringly obvious to everyone and maybe even themselves, healing and changing behavior is very hard. The Gospel, though, is powerful enough to change lives. If God can raise your dead soul to eternal life, He can also, by His grace, help you fight your demons in this life. But sometimes, we see someone conquer their demons and their sins and we instinctively understand "that person will never be the same. That person won't live for themselves anymore, since the power of Christ has made them alive, they will certainly live for Christ and not themselves." And despite the incredible beauty of that, that scares us.

Most of the time, we don't want to see our pigs run into the lake and drown, even if that is the best way



to remove the idols from our lives. We are simply too scared to change... and that makes the loving power of God scary too. He offers us His life, but we instead cling terrified to own life, which is really our own death. We beg Jesus to go somewhere else. Well, do not fear the power of God anymore. The wrath of God was poured out on Christ, so that all who believe in Christ are free from the wrath of God. The power of God has no wrath towards them, only grace. So believe on Christ. Beg Him to dwell in your town and in your heart. Do not send or beg Him to leave your soul.

Missed a Sunday church service?



"Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing?" Matthew 6:25

Recently, I have been reading a lot about the sermon on the mount and the words that Jesus spoke during them. If you don't know the sermon on the mount can be found in the book of Matthew taking up all of chapters 5, 6, and 7. In it you can find the beatitudes, the golden rule, and... an important lesson on anxiety.

In this sermon, Jesus tells us not to be anxious. He says that the birds don't sow or reap and yet the Father takes care of them, and if God does this, how much more does He love us and want to take care of us? I think the most important part of this is how Jesus goes about talking about how to cure anxiety

He reminds us that He loves us more than any other part of creation and we are most valuable to Him. But then, in verse 27, He reminds us what anxiety brings. Jesus says, "And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life?" This is our reminder that stress **can** be good and it can bring about energy and change, but anxiety on the other hand is always unhealthy. Not only can it not change what is happening ("can it add a single hour to our lives") but it also can take away from our lives. By engaging in an activity that does not enrich our lives (anxiety) we are taking away from the blessing that God has shown us and the knowledge that He will always take care of us and enrich our lives if we allow Him to.
