Margie noted that the General Fund shows \$47,158.40 and of that amount \$36,097 is our new Payroll Protection Program grant/loan.

Margie ran a comparison of the past 8 weeks that the church has been closed in comparison to the same 8 weeks in 2019. Our donations to the General Fund are running about 72% of what they were a year ago.

The furnace is paid off so it does not show as a Special Fund any more.

Deacon's Report - Kevin Lee

After discussing the Corona Virus situation and reading medical advice from Michelle and Garrett Placke, and Stephanie Hottman, it was decided that we will begin holding church services on May 17th with the congregation present. Only one church is open in Beulah so far and a few more were expected to open on May 10th. Intern Pastor Kevin will give the message on the 17th as it will be his last official Sunday at Prince of Peace.

The Deacons discussed the following changes to services in accordance with North Dakota guidelines:

Sitting in household groups with six feet between groups; wear face masks; no passing offering plates; no hand shaking or hugs; no bulletins or hymnals or pew Bibles; hope to leave entrance doors propped open; Handwash stations at doors and extra face masks available; Library and children's nursery area closed; no toys or toy bags provided by church; nursing mothers can use nursing mother room; more than usual sanitizing of bathrooms and the rest of church.

Communion will have to be modified. Several options were considered.

Seth Larson and Caleb Sperry have been trained by Kevin Hall to record our Church services and will work in the sound booth to do this.

The Spring Spiritual Life Meetings with recorded messages from various missionaries that our church supports were a success. We voted to give \$200.00 to each of the six missionaries from the Deacon's fund.

Seth asked for guidelines on meeting with and ministering to the youth during this time. For now, we recommended meeting only outside in smaller groups and not in the youth room. Counseling can continue in one on one situations with proper social distancing.

Trustee's Report - Keith Peterson

The snow blower hasn't been fixed yet – he will get parts this summer. Keith will be working on hanging bulletin boards with Angie Wanzek for Christian Ed. The trustees are dealing with some insulation in ceiling in fellowship hall. It was noted that a valve on the dishwasher is leaking. We need to install smoke alarms for insurance purposes. Jim Wenning will find the guidelines for how many smoke alarms and where we will need to install them.

<u>Christian Ed Report – Angie Wanzek</u>

Old Business: Confirmation pictures will be taken by Justine from Natural Impressions. Flowers will be ordered for 1 female and 2 males. No cake as there is no fellowship the month of May.

New Business: Graduation Recognition will be Sunday, May 17th. There will be a digital slide show of the seniors created and Pastor Kent will pray for them. Those that are in attendance will be recognized, however, we are not asking them to be present. Graduation gifts are ordered. They are a Visual Theology Guide to the Bible: Seeing and Knowing God's Word. They were highly recommended. They will be wrapped and Angie will deliver them to their homes.

VBS: We are looking at August 2nd-6th as possible dates. We are tabling this until we know more what is happening with COV-19.

OLD BUSINESS

Church Van Storage – put on hold. The church van is currently at Carl Sorenson's shop.

Faithlife Equip Program – 67 households have registered.

VBS – It has been rescheduled in August but will hold off planning until July 1. The AFLC Bible School is not sending out summer teams this year so we will be doing it on our own.

Annual Conference – The annual conference has been rescheduled to August 10-13

NEW BUSINESS

Tithe - We voted to split our tithe: \$2,411.56 to \$2,111.56 to AFLC Home Missions and \$300 to Lacey Wenning Biggs for her mission trip.

Church use after May 17th – The FMSC Mobile Pack Committee would like to plan a fleishkekla fundraiser in June. M & L Concessions would bring their food truck and prepare the fleishkekla outside. They would do pickup only or eat outside if it's nice.

We discussed other church activities. Those groups that want to meet in the church should make sure to let the office know so they can be added to the church calendar. Our janitors will then know when and where cleaning needs to be done.

We approved having WMF Bible study in fellowship hall with social distancing after May 17. We discussed youth activities being held outside for the time being and we will again discuss youth activities at the June meeting.

Intern Kevin Hall – Kevin Hall's ordination June 14 in Grafton. Kevin's last official day will be about May 17. We voted to pay him for entire month of May. We will be having a card shower for Kevin and Amy Hall.
