"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the

Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:18–20 ESV)

This year has been an absolute mess. The pandemic has affected our families on every level, from our jobs, to our schools, our recreation, travel, and even our doctor appointments, just to name a few. And it also had a big impact on the ministry of the church.

As all of you know, we shut down the church in March. Instead of having in-person worship, we watched it on YouTube or Facebook. Our confirmation classes were conducted on Go-to-

Meeting, as were many of our meetings. Youth ministry also moved on-line. In most cases, visitation was nearly impossible. However, although we can all agree that it was far from ideal, we made it work.

It was a joy to return to in-person worship in mid-May. However, with some still fearful of the Coronavirus, with the end of the school year, and with summer travels and camping upon us, things have never quite returned to normal. Our worship services have been much smaller than what is typical for us.

We did add some ministry that has not typically happened during the summer months. Seth conducted high school youth group, which was well attended. And we also had Wednesday evening Bible study, with good participation.

With the new school year upon us, I am hoping and praying that we will have much more normalcy at Prince of Peace. As we see in the above passage,

we have received a call to make disciples of all nations. And this is best done in person.

We will still keep some modifications in place. The offering plates will remain in the back of the sanctuary rather than passing them down the rows. Hand sanitizer will continue to be available at all entrances. For the time being, we will continue to bring communion to you, in your seats, rather than have everyone come up front. If it makes you more comfortable, you can feel free to wear a mask. And, for now, we'll continue with our modified fellowship.

However, confirmation classes will be held as normal. Youth activities will be held as normal. We will also have in-person Sunday School for children and adults. Wednesday night Bible study will continue. And fall activities, such as Spiritual Life Meetings, have been scheduled.

We must bear in mind that, if circumstances drastically worsen in our state and in our local area, changes could once again be made. If I, someone in my family, Seth, or Becca get sick, modifications may need to be made. But our hope and prayer is that we can carry out the ministry entrusted to us to the best of our abilities.

That being said, if your health is compromised in any way, or if you feel that your participation is too risky, we understand completely. However, please communicate with us. We want to do all that we can to ensure that your spiritual needs, in addition to your physical needs, are provided for.

Prince of Peace will once again be starting Sunday School on September 13, 2020. The Board of Christian Education understands that the last few months have been unsettled with great uncertainty. As we move forward with the education of our youth, the board would like to inform families and members about how Sunday School will look this year.

Our goal is too conduct Sunday School as normal as possible. Students and teachers will not be required to wear mask. However, if a family would like to have their children wear one, Prince of Peace will support your decision. Classes for ages Preschool-Eighth with have an average attendance of approximately 4-7. Sunday School rooms will be the largest we have access to, and students will be encouraged to spread out. Physical distance of 6ft between will be hard to maintain.

High School Youth Group and Middle School Bible School will continue as normal. Students will be encouraged to physically distance and larger and/or outdoor spaces will be utilized.

The Board of Christian Education is aware that the Public-School system is following a color-coded system of attendance. Sunday School at Prince of Peace will be held if the school system is Blue, Green, Yellow and Orange. If the school system moves to Red, all youth activities ages Preschool to Grade 12 will be moved on-line. This included HS Youth Group, Middle School Bible Study, and Confirmation.

If you are uncomfortable with your child attending Sunday School, materials will be available for families to utilize at home. Please contact the Board of Christian Ed to request them.

Attendance is a required element of Confirmation. Any concerns with your child attending Confirmation in person, please contact Pastor Kent.
