"Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. And I saw the holy city,

new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man. He will dwell with them, and they will be his people, and God himself will be with them as their God. He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away.""

Revelation 21:1-4 ESV

As we read the above text, I think we can agree that it captures that for which we long. We want to live forever in a place where God dwells with us. We want to live in a place where there is no more death. We want to live in a place where there is no

more mourning, crying, or pain. And we want to live in a place where God himself has wiped every tear from our eye.

However, it increasingly seems like we understand this place to be the world in which we now live. It seems as if we are looking to worldly means to attain for us this blessing. And it seems that the only thing that matters to us is the here and now.

It seems more and more that our focus is upon this world. It seems more and more that our focus is on this life. It seems that, more and more, we are seeking to erase the consequences of sin and to create some sort of heaven on earth.

It seems that we trust in the goodness of human nature to get us there. It seems that we trust in our ability to improve and to grow to get us there. It seems as though we trust in the right leader to get us there. It seems that we trust in military might and adequate policing to provide these blessings. It seems that we trust in medicine and medical

technology to get us there. And it seems that we trust in the right degree from the right school to get us there.

Please don't misunderstand me. I'm not suggesting that we cease our efforts to improve the world in which we live. Nor am I suggesting that we cease all efforts to love our neighbor and to both help him and to advocate for his welfare. After all, we're called by God to minister to the needs of those around us with the gifts and the blessings he's entrusted to us.

However, we must understand that the blessings for which we long will only be received at the time of Jesus' return. They will be experienced only in the new creation that will accompany him. We must understand that they will never be attained in the here and now.

Our hope, then, is found in Christ and in no one else. It's found not in this life, but in the life that's to come. And it's found not in this world, but in the next.

For this reason, we must trust in Christ and anticipate his return. We must believe his promise and hope for its fulfillment. And we must know and believe that, by his death and resurrection, he's done everything necessary to provide for us these blessings.

This is the purpose of the Advent season, into which we just entered. We remember the anticipation of the saints of old for the coming of the Savior. And, in the same way, we both anticipate and long for his return.

Especially when so many things that were once held sacred are now thrown to the curb in most social situations. We look at a world that once held family sacred, but now is so willing to say that divorce is a fine and even a good thing. And a world that once held life in the most important of places in our hearts, but now thinks that it is no longer immoral to abort a child. We as believers need to agree that these things and many others are held sacred and wrong and that there are in fact absolute rights and wrongs in this world that God says that we will be judged by when our time comes. But thanks to God he has laid a way out of these sins for us, and we find that hope in Jesus and his death. If we combine the theology of the absolute rights and wrongs in

this world and mix that with the Gospel and what God has done for us, then there will be no person that will be unwilling to turn to Christ because they know their sins, and they know how to be forgiven!

President's Report - Marvin Sigman

Marvin went to the Deacon's meeting. He is working on a FMSC bulletin to take to other community churches.

Pastor's Report - Pastor Kent

Confirmation is going well, as we have begun looking at the third article of the Apostles' Creed.

We hosted the Youth & Children's Ministry Workshop for the Western North Dakota/Eastern Montana District of the AFLC.

We had our fall Spiritual Life Meetings, this past month, with Pastor Brian Ricke from Minneapolis.

We hosted a meeting and worship service for the Lutheran Mission Society, which partners with our Alaska mission.

I traveled to lowa to conduct the funeral for my grandmother. A special thanks to Kevin Lee for flying me down so I could both do this, and continue my engagement with activities here.

I helped to cook and led our Bible study for the men's group this month, where we're focusing on Discipling Our Family

We received \$36,097 from the Payroll Protection Program grant/loan which is in the General Fund Margie reported that it looks like the entire PPP grant/loan has been forgiven according to the computer records.

Deacon's Report - Kevin Lee

Thanksgiving worship/pie social – In light of Covid, we will still have the event, but pie slices will be already on paper plates for us instead of having everybody touch the serving utensils.

As most of the community assistance is directed through the ministerial, and as our deacon fund hasn't been largely used again this year, Pastor encouraged that we give a portion of those funds to the ministerial to help with these needs. Last year, we directed \$500 for this purpose. The Deacons agreed to do so again.

Christmas worship – We will still plan for candles to be handed out with attention to minimal personal contact.

Pastor visited with Pastor Wade Mobley when he was down in Minneapolis last week. Although we don't have firm dates, he affirmed that it should work in his schedule to come for our Spring Spiritual Life Meetings.

<u>Trustee's Report - Keith Peterson</u>

Keith reported that he fixed the snowblower, put on new skids and changed the oil. It has been moved to the shed to be stored. There is a plug-in outside with a new extension cord for the snowblower.

He purchased new snow shovels and brooms and placed them by all the doors.

The emergency lighting in kitchen doesn't work. Dustin Buchmann will look at the lights – it might be the battery pack.

Treasurers Report - Margie Lee

The insulation in fellowship hall ceiling is falling down. Keith proposed to run 1 x 4s to hold the insulation up. To repair the area from The Warehouse to the Sunday School rooms in the fellowship hall would take 256 boards – about \$1,100 total. To repair just the Fellowship Hall would be about \$700. We approved repairing the Fellowship Hall insulation for approximately \$750.

<u>Christian Ed Report – Angie Wanzek</u>

Night in Bethlehem is tentatively set for December 5th. It will be held for church member families only due to Covid.

Sunday school rooms were looked at as many classes are at 10+ students making distancing very hard. Discussion was had about opening a wall between two rooms and putting in a sliding/accordion door that can be opened to better accommodate bigger classes. In the short term using the fellowship area was discussed as an option, as were others.

Rebeca expressed the need for additional help as they have an influx of kids attending youth bible studies as many are bringing friends. Discussion was had to add an additional bible study group on a Sunday night to break down the number of kids attending each class.

Update: Council discussed taking one of the walls out of the Sunday School rooms in the fellowship hall area to make a larger room for social distancing – perhaps in January.

Seth reported they have more helpers from High School and an adult helping with Youth Bible studies.

OLD BUSINESS

LED Light Replacement – Have 2 more lights to replace in the Fellowship Hall.

Outside Concrete Work –Garner Sailer has some contacts that will do concrete work and we will check on those people.

Van Storage Building – Dustin Buchmann is working on plans.

NEW BUSINESS

Tithe - We voted to split our Tithe of \$2,236.61: \$300 to Feed My Starving Children and split the

remainder \$1,936.61 evenly to FLBC and AFLC Home Missions.

Church Sign between Beulah and Hazen – A panel on the sign listing churches in Beulah has pulled away. Company recommended considering putting up a new sign. The cost of sign is \$2,900 plus installation. Beulah Ministerial is requesting \$300 from each church. We approved donated \$300 for the sign.

Mission Fund – We discussed that there is \$725.21 in the Mission Fund with more coming in each offering. We approved sending \$250 each to the 3 Alaska missionaries.

OLD BUSINESS

Fellowship Room Ceiling/Insulation/Lights Update – The Fellowship Hall lights have been replaced as LEDs as they go out. There was a possibility of a grant to upgrade to LED lights, but that appears to be done.

North Entrance Walkway and Southeast Sloped Walkway Replacement – There were problems getting the concrete contractor to commit to the project, so this will be done in 2021 with a different contractor.

2021 Annual Budget - Margie Lee presented the budget highlighting the changes. Our new sanctuary building loan was taken out in April 2015 for \$250,000 and is at the Union Bank at 4.5% interest rate. Balance as of 11/10/2020 was \$93,646.42.
