"For we never came with words of flattery, as you know, nor with a pretext for greed—God is witness. Nor did we seek glory from people,

whether from you or from others, though we could have made demands as apostles of Christ. But we were gentle among you, like a nursing mother taking care of her own children. So, being affectionately desirous of you, we were ready to share with you not only the gospel of God but also our own selves, because you had become very dear to us."

1 Thessalonians 2:5-8 ESV

I'm greatly excited as we enter into the month of April. I'm excited, first of all, to celebrate Easter with all of you. This is especially true as, last year at this time, we felt compelled to cancel Easter worship due to concerns related to Covid. And, as you're aware, we canceled all in-person activities for about a month.

As I've shared with you before, one of the convictions this period of time built into me was the necessity of the gathering together of the body of Christ. When I say this, I certainly believed it before. But it has also taken on an entirely new meaning.

Although I'm glad we've been able to provide access to our worship services online, and although it has been a great blessing to several people in particular, I don't think we can rightfully draw a distinction between in-person and online ministry. The simple fact of the matter is that ministry is best done in-person. It's best done as we gather with the body of Christ. It's best done in relationship to one another.

I understand that we may, at times, face circumstances that prevent this. However, that being said, ministry is about sharing not only the gospel, but also our lives with one another. Ministry takes place as we lovingly care for one another.

We see this in the passage above, as Paul recounts his motivations to the church at Thessalonica. He wasn't seeking his own gain, nor to simply tickle the ears of the people. His motive was one of love.

He compares his ministry to a nursing mother, taking care of her own children. It was gentle, he says. And it was an expression of loving concern.

Because of his affection for them, he sought to share with them not only the gospel. He sought to share with them his life. He sought to share with them his very self.

Although most of us understand this, it's also contrary to the practice of many. Church, for many of us, is about doing our duty. It's about attending worship, but getting out of the church as fast as possible.

We don't generally build relationships with our fellow church members. And, for this reason, we miss out on what the church has to offer. We fail to receive ministry from our fellow believers, and we fail to minister to them.

My hope and prayer is that each of us will appreciate the value of the body of Christ. My hope and prayer is that we'll enjoy all that it has to offer. I hope and pray that each one of us will joyfully receive ministry from others in the church, as we share life with them. And I hope and pray that we'll joyfully minister to others as we gather with them.

For the last month or so the High School Sunday School has been going over the book of Exodus and the leaving of the Hebrews from slavery in Egypt to the promised land. Something caught my eye that I don't think I have ever really noticed before and I wanted to share it with you today

¹³ And Moses said to the people, "Fear not, stand firm, and see the salvation of the LORD, which he will work for you today. For the Egyptians whom you see today, you shall never see again. ¹⁴ The LORD will fight for you, and you have only to be silent." Exodus 14:13-14

In this passage, the Hebrews have just left Egypt and are finally free, but not soon after Pharoah sees what he has just lost and decides to go and find and either kill or bring back the Hebrews to Egypt. They see Pharoah coming for them with his army and they are terrified, but Moses gives them comfort in this time of immense stress. And I can't help but think, "Wow, that's exactly what I think when I am stressed", and in turn, that's exactly what God tells us when I am thinking those thoughts

Now, I know that more than likely none of us have had an invading army coming at us to probably kill us. But despite that, I still have moments where I am freaking out a lot like the Hebrews were in that moment. And the words that were of

God that Moses spoke to his people are the exact words that God tells us today. Don't worry, "I will fight for you, and you only have to be silent."

After the Security Seminar, we will be looking at incorporating some different practices in the next few months. The people that attended will the seminar will meet and bring to the council some options.

Nursery Toys – We decided that a limited number of toys can be placed in the nursery to play with. Everyone agreed there are too many toys so we will remove some of the toys – especially the ones that are difficult to clean.
