"So if there is any encouragement in Christ, any comfort from love, any participation in the Spirit, any affection and sympathy, complete my

joy by being of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves."

Philippians 2:1-3 ESV

The church is, and has always been, very diverse. It's made up of people of varying ages. It's made up of people from different places and backgrounds. And it's made up of people of various races.

We are one in Christ. Our faith in Jesus unifies us. However, that being said, we do continue to have differences regarding our preferences.

When I talk about preferences, I'm referring to matters that are neither right nor wrong. They're

simply a matter of taste. And, in some cases they're simply a matter of culture.

One of the areas where this is often seen in the church is in the area of music. There are those in the church who prefer the traditional, and dislike the new. There are those in the church who prefer the new, and dislike the traditional. And there are those, like myself, who have an appreciation for both.

For this reason, music has often been a divisive issue in the church. However, that being said, it should not be. And it will not be if we follow the direction of Scripture.

Paul tells us, in the above passage, that we're to do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit. Instead, we're to count others as more significant than ourselves. In other words, we're to be driven not by our own desires. We're to be driven not by our own taste. We're to, rather, place the concerns of others ahead of our own.

What, then, does this mean as it pertains to music? It means that, if I prefer the traditional, I'm not

going to insist that it be the only style used in the church. And, in the same way, if I prefer the new or the contemporary, I'm not going to insist that it be the only style used in the church. Out of love for my brother and sister in Christ, I am going to count them as more significant than myself.

What this means practically is that, at Prince of Peace, as long as we have those who prefer traditional music and who can play it for us, we will use it in our worship service. In the same way, as long as we have those who prefer contemporary music and who can play it for us, we are going to use it in our worship service. And, out of love for our brother and sister in Christ, we will not disregard his preference and cause a stink about it.

That being said, as we are looking to revamp our worship team, we are looking for those who are gifted in music, and who are willing to bless the congregation with that gift. We are looking for those who sing and who play various instruments to participate with our worship team. Even if it seems that we have every instrument covered and plenty of singers, we still need you. And even if you can't commit to being involved all of the time, we still need you.

We would like to have enough people that we can rotate singers and musicians. We would like to have enough to ensure that the entire burden doesn't fall on a small group of individuals. We would like to have enough to ensure that those who are serving in this way feel free to take a Sunday off or to travel without disrupting the worship service.

For this reason, if you do sing or play an instrument, please talk to me, Kevin Lee, or Michele Klein. We'd like to involve you as the team gets going again this summer.

What are Our Expectations?

12 remember that you were at that time separated from Christ, alienated from the commonwealth of Israel and strangers to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world. 13 But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. - Ephesians 2:12-13

What are your expectations of others? How do you expect them to act? How do you think they expect you to behave? Do you think there is a difference? These are the questions that I have been pondering the past week. And I think there are some key misunderstandings that many Christians seem to be making that should be talked about.

As we see in Ephesians, there was a time that we all were without Christ. We were born into sin and because of that we were separated from God, but Jesus bridged the gap and allowed us to cross through the cross (see what I did there;). And during that time, we didn't know how to act. We followed the law of the land and listened to those put over us but we didn't know about God's law other than our conscience, AKA God's law "written on our hearts." But then God got a hold of us and helped us realize our need for salvation, and when we accept

we learn of God's law and why it is important.... And that's all great

However, there are people on Earth that don't know God's law because they haven't accepted God into their heart. And it is in how we treat these people that they see how merciful God is. If you have a child, you don't expect them to know how to do adult things, you have to teach them. Well, it is the same way with sin, we can't chastise non-believers for sinning or making bad decisions because they don't know the right decisions to make. We can lovingly nudge, and correct gracefully, and guide as Jesus did, but we can't condemn people that don't have Jesus in their life when they make mistakes. As it says in Ephesians, "Remember that you were once separated from Christ," and we need to remember that when we are interacting with unbelievers who are in the place that we also were not so long ago.

Angie also discussed having VBS run differently with parents checking kids in and out and having only one door unlocked to limit access to the building. Council recommended that this be looked at during the Church Security meeting on April 15.

his angels: for I was hungry and you gave Me NO food; I was thirsty and gave Me NO drink; I was a stranger and you did NOT take Me in, naked and you did NOT clothe Me, sick and in prison and you did NOT visit Me; Then they also will answer Him, saying, Lord, when did we see You hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not minister to You?

Then He will answer them, saying, Assuredly, I say to you, inasmuch as you did Not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do It to Me. And these will go away into everlasting punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."
