Pastor Kent

Most of us know and believe that we are saved only by the grace of God. Our works play no part in it, nor can they. It's a free gift of God.

We know also and believe that this grace is received only by faith. It's through faith in Jesus that we receive the grace of God and are saved. As we read in Ephesians 2:8-9: *"For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast."*

However, what is this faith and where does it come from? Have you ever thought about that? How do we come by this faith which enables us to receive the grace of God?

Most of us tend to think that our faith results from our ability to reason. This is why so many of us believe that babies cannot have faith and that they are automatically saved. We reason that they are not yet at the point where they are able to believe.

Scripture, however, tells us otherwise. David tells us in Psalm 22:9-10, for example, that God made him to have faith while he was at his mother's breast. From the time he was an infant, God made him to believe.

In Matthew 18 we see that, calling to himself a small child, Jesus told the people that unless they became like children, they would never enter the kingdom of heaven. And he went on to say that whoever caused one of these little ones who believe in him to sin, would be better off dead. In this way, Jesus clearly stated that young children can have faith.

The Bible is equally clear that none of us can come to faith on our own. In 1 Corinthians 2, Paul tells us that the natural person (the person without the Spirit) cannot understand the things of God. And in Romans 3, Paul tells us that there is no one who understands or who seeks for God. So, even as adults, we are incapable of understanding the gospel. Our ability to reason has no bearing on this whatsoever.

As we investigate this further, we learn that it's only by the Spirit of God that we are able to confess faith in Jesus. Paul tells us at the beginning of 1 Corinthians 12 that a Spirit-filled person cannot deny Christ. And he goes on to say that a person without the Spirit cannot confess Jesus as Lord. In the same way, in John 6, Jesus says that no one can come to him unless he's drawn by the Father.

This tells us that, just as salvation is a gift of God, so too is faith. The ability to believe in Jesus, the ability to trust in Christ, is not something we possess on our own. It's something that God enables in us.

And, finally, we see that this faith is received through the Word of God. Paul tells us in Romans 10:17 that faith comes by hearing, and hearing through the Word of Christ. So, it's as we hear God's Word, and as the Holy Spirit works through the Word, that we're enabled to believe.

This, then, reveals to us why it's so important for us to be in the Word of God. It reveals to us why it's so important for us to share the Word of God with our children. And it reveals to us why it's so important for us to share God's Word with those who don't yet believe. It's through this Word that God works in us, enabling us to believe and to be saved.

You are joined together with peace though to Spirit, so make every effort to continue together in this way. Ephesians 4:3 ncv

We cannot say, "I have no need of you." The megachurch needs the smaller church. The liberal needs the conservative. The pastor needs the missionary, Cooperation is more than a good Idea; it is a command (Ephesians 4;3 niv). There is "one flock and one shepherd" (John 10:16 niv). Unity matters to God.

Maybe because life is so filled with defeat and heartbreak, we find ourselves turning to you, yielding ourselves to your will, fighting less furiously for selfish, often empty goals. And when this happens we find that you have turned our suffering and our failures into little stepping-stones.

Looking back, we see them. These rocks which gradually, all unknown to us, you have been shaping to lead us toward our purpose...And we have been following! However blindly, however zigzag the course, yet we have been moving toward it.

And looking about, we see there are results. There are signals, heartening little affirmations, unexpected proofs.

However humble our circumstances or undramatic our talents, our true purpose has been revealed. We were meant to be this person at this time and place. Not only for ourselves, but for you and other people--we were meant to make this particular contribution to the world.

And so we must do it will. Do it with faith and patience, with all our strength and passion. And in so doing discover who we really are.

When we want to or need to communicate with God and especially pray to Him, it can be easy to get distracted. When I am trying to commune with God, I constantly find myself thinking about other things or people. I'll be mid-prayer and realize that I have been going over the grocery list in my head or thinking about what I need to do after I am done "praying" or wondering what other people are doing right now.

We may talk a big game, but in the end, it is really easy to get us distracted and to stop us from communicating with our heavenly father. We so quickly (and efficiently) can go from a solid discussion with God to thinking about anything else and we sometimes don't even notice. What can be done to help stop this behavior?

I think the key with this, as well as most things, is intentionality. Are you being intentional with your prayer time, or just letting things happen? It's not wrong to pray whenever you feel led, but there needs to be time in your day when you will definitely and intentionally pray. I, for instance, like to pray right after I wake up and right before I go to bed. These aren't the only times I pray in a day, but they get me started and end my days where they need to. But even with this plan, I need another plan. We need to have a plan, roughly, of what we want to talk to God about, otherwise we may slip into the same prayer every day that may lead to not thinking and getting distracted. We need plans, then we need more plans. I'm not saying it's wrong to just pray with no plan, sometimes we need that. But if that's all we have, there is a good chance we will slip into lazy, unintentional, unproductive, and unHoly prayer. And that is what separates us from God, which I have found is best if avoided :)
