Pastor Kent

"Pray for us, for we are sure that we have a clear conscience, desiring to act honorably in all things. I urge you the more earnestly to do this in order that

I may be restored to you the sooner." Hebrews 13:18-19 ESV

As your pastor, I spend a great deal of time in prayer for each of you. Whether I'm aware of a specific need or not, I bring each of you before the Lord on a regular basis. It's simply a part of my ongoing care of you.

As we read through the New Testament, Paul often shares with his readers the fact that he's praying for them. But he doesn't stop there. We see also that he asks for prayer from his readers. And we see the same from the author of Hebrews, in the passage above.

I'm doing the same thing right here and now. Many of you have expressed that you regularly pray for

me, and I appreciate this more than you know. But, by now, you've likely heard that I have a specific need that I would like you to lift up to the Lord.

Eleven years ago, I was diagnosed with a heart condition known as Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy. It's a genetic condition that I inherited from my father. Up to this point, I've been treated with medication that has helped immensely. However, since this past fall, I haven't been feeling as well. And my recent check-up, at Mayo, revealed that my condition has worsened.

For this reason, I have been scheduled for openheart surgery on September 14th. Although the surgery isn't a cure for my condition, it will enable my heart to better function. In fact, I've been assured that most, if not all, of my physical limitations will be eliminated.

The surgery will take place at Mayo Clinic in Rochester. I have one of the best surgeons at Mayo performing the procedure. And, assuming all goes well, I'll be down there for about a week. Coming home, I'll also be taking the needed time for recovery. Based on the input of my doctor, the church council and I are planning and preparing for me to be out of commission for a month. And, when I'm able to resume my duties, I'll have to slowly work back up to a full-time schedule.

Please pray for me, as I anticipate this surgery. Pray that all goes well, during the procedure. And please pray for my recovery.

My wife will initially keep the church informed regarding the surgery and my condition. I will, as well, as I improve.

Our chairman, Marvin Sigman, is lining up people to preach while I'm gone. Don Buck is lining up service leaders. Les Buchman will teach the adult Sunday School class until I return. Seth will handle confirmation. Unless you hear otherwise, Wednesday night Bible study will resume when I'm well. And if there are emergencies, or if pastoral care is needed, please talk to Marvin Sigman or Kevin Lee.

Thank you in advance for your prayers and understanding.

And so, from the day we heard, we have not ceased



Decide Now

The good man does not escape all troubleshe has them too. But the Lord helps him in each and every one. Psalm 34: 19 TLB

Voices await you today. At work, in your cul-de-sac, at school, on the internet. They're waiting for you. They stand on the intersections of your social life and family. You can't eliminate their presence. But you can prepare for their invitation.

Remember who you are; you God child. You've been bought by the most precious commodity in the history of the universe; the blood of Christ. You are indwelled by the Spirit of the living God. You are being equipped for an eternal assignment that will empower you to live in the very presence of God, You have been set apart for a holy calling. You are his.

The Devil has no jurisdiction over you. He acts as if he does. He walks with a swagger and brings temptation, but as you resist him and turn to God, he must flee (James 4:7).

Decide now what you will say when the voices speak.

Choose obedience. And, as you do, you can expect blessings: The blessing of a clean conscience, the blessing of a good night's sleep, the blessing of God's fellowship, the blessing of God's favor. This is no guarantee of an easy life. It is the assurance of God's help, and it is your claim.

Total Dependence of God

Absolute surrender involves giving up our desires, goals, and preferences to God and accepting God's will, regardless of how difficult it may be. Another adjustment we must make to do God's will is reaching a place of total dependence of God. Jesus said, "You can do nothing without Me" (John15:5). As God's servants, we must be in that intimate relationship so He will complete His work through us. WE must depend of God alone. When we surrender our lives completely, we become totally dependent on Him. Then we understand that, apart from Him, we can do nothing. We must learn to live in constant awareness of our absolute reliance on God if he is to accomplish His purposes through us.

This adjustment requires a shift from doing work for God according to our abilities, gifts, goals, likes and dislikes to being totally dependent on God, His working, and his resources. It requires courage and faith.

Read the following Scriptures, and notice why we must depend on God to carry out his purposes:

• I am the vine; you are the branches. The one who remains in Me and I in him produces much fruit, because you can do nothing without Me."(john 15:5)

• By God's grace I am what I am, and His grace toward me was not ineffective. However, I worked more than any of them, yet not I, but God's grace that we with me. (1 Cor. 15:10)

• I have been crucified with Christ, and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the flesh, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me. (Gal.2:20)

• The Lord of hosts has sworn, saying, "As I have planned, so it will be: as I have purposed it, so it will happen" (Isa. 14:24)

• Do not fear, for I am with you; do not be afraid, for I am your God. I will strengthen you; I will help you; I will hold on to you with my righteous right hand." (Isa. 41:10)

• I am God, and there is no other... My plan will take place, and I will do all My will.... Yes, I have

spoken: so I will also bring it about. I have planned it: I will also do It."(Isa. 46:9-11)

If God is not at work in you, you can do nothing to bear spiritual fruit. As you are crucified with Christ, He lives through you to accomplish His purposes by His grace. When God sets out to do something, He guarantees that it will come to pass. He is the one who will accomplish what He intends to do. If you depend on anything other than God, you are asking for failure.

I am very happy to announce that we have all of our SS teachers! Yeah! We may need a few helpers yet and we the list of substitutes is very short and to be honest I am not sure there is anyone on the list. If you are willing to help, please let me know. Please pray that the students will have a heart eager to learn about God and to practice what they learn not only on Sunday but throughout the week. Please also pray for the teachers as they prepare and teach the lessons. I think of Barb Gustafson every year when SS starts. She would bring a string 168 inches long to SS and each inch represented 1 hour of the week. We have church and SS for about 3 hours (which is generously rounded up) each week and if that is the only time that we spend learning about God and instilling values that will help us throughout the week we are going to struggle when we are tempted to sin. In those few hours we simply can't teach your child everything. I know I mentioned earlier this summer that if we only ate once a week our bodies would be malnourished and unable to complete the simplest of tasks the same is true of our souls. Please use SS as a tool to start a conversation with your child about God. With the internet and radio there are several ways to plug God into our lives while in the car or at home. At the church, we have a 365-day devotional book that we give to families to read at home. If you are interested, please let me know and I will get one for you. VBS Wrap Up: We also want to continue to do a service project during the week. This year kids tied lap blankets made of fleece for the care center residents. The kids collected 555 lbs of food for WARC food pantry with the boys winning the water balloon fight w/ the most items collected. We also collected \$37+ which was also donated to WARC.

OLD BUSINESS

NEW BUSINESS
