"Since therefore the children share in flesh and blood, he himself likewise partook of the same things, that through death he might destroy the

one who has the power of death, that is, the devil, and deliver all those who through fear of death were subject to lifelong slavery." Hebrews 2:14-15 ESV

The Christmas story is one that is known by most everyone. It's known not only by those who believe in him. It's known also by those who reject what Scripture says of him. However, even though believers and unbelievers alike know the story and get caught up in the celebration of Christmas, many objections are raised to its message.

One such objection involves the incarnation itself. Besides wondering how it's possible, some wonder why God had to become man in the first place. They wonder why he took on flesh and lived among his creation.

We find the answer to this question in the above passage. The author of Hebrews tells us, first of all, that Jesus became like us. He partook of flesh and blood. And the reason he did this is that he might accomplish our salvation.

As most of us know, this was accomplished by Jesus' death on the cross. In this way, he paid the penalty of our sin. He died on our behalf and satisfied the wrath of God.

However, one of the things that stands out as we consider the nature of God is that he cannot die. God is not mortal. He's immortal, eternal, and unchanging.

If he, then, was to pay the penalty of our sin, he had to become man. If he was to die on our behalf, he had to take on flesh. If he was to satisfy the righteous requirement of God's justice, he had to take on our nature.

In this way, by taking on human flesh and dying on the cross, he destroyed the devil. He destroyed the one who accuses us before God. And he delivers us from our slavery to the fear of death.


In other words, because of Jesus, we no longer have to live in fear of death. Because he took on flesh, we're no longer held in bondage by our fear of death. And because he died on our behalf, we know that life eternal is ours.

Some will object that none of this was necessary. They tell us that God could have forgiven us apart from Christ's sacrifice. And they tell us that he could simply overlook our sin. Nothing, however, is further from the truth.

Because he is righteous, God cannot allow sin into his presence. Because he is holy, he cannot tolerate wrongdoing. And because he is just, the penalty of our sin has to be paid.

By the incarnation, you see, the nature and the character of God were upheld. They were in no way violated. And, at the same time, our salvation was realized.

The Kindness of God

But when the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. Titus 3:4-5

"How than can I do this great wickedness, and sin against God?" Genesis 29:9

God's kindness stirred Joseph's holiness. The temptation Potiphar's wife so freely offered was likely strong. Joseph had seen the kindness of God, the grace and mercy that rescued him from the bottom of a well. And Joseph simply could not sin against God's kindness.

God's grace does the same in us. "For the grace of God... teaches us to say 'No' to ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright and godly lives in this present age" (Titus 2:11-12 NIV). A robust grace this is, that both convicts and comforts! Let it convict you. If you ever catch yourself thinking, I can do whatever I want because God will forgive me, then grace is not happening to you. Selfishness, perhaps. Arrogance, for sure. But Grace? No. Grace creates a resolve to do good, not permission to do bad.

And let grace comfort you. Look to Christ for your beginning and ending. He is Alpha and Omega. He will hold you. And he will hold on to the ones you love. Do you have a prodigal? Do you long for your spouse to return to God? Do you have a friend whose faith has grown cold? God wants them back more than you do. Keep praying and don't give up.

Quiet Time with God

"The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters." Psalm 23:1-2

Many people rarely go anywhere without a cell phone, iPod, laptop, or pager. We have become accessible 24 hours a day. Some psychologists see this craving to stay connected as an addiction. Yet a growing number of people are deliberately limiting their use of technology. Being a "tech-no" is their way of preserving times of quiet, while limiting the flow of information into their lives.

Many followers of Christ find that a daily time of Bible reading and prayer is essential in their walk of faith. This "quiet time" is a disconnection from external distractions in order to connect with God. The "green pastures" and "still waters" of Psalm 23:2 are more than an idyllic country scene. They speak of our communion with God whereby He restores our souls and leads us in His paths. All of us can make time to meet with God, but do we? In Robert Foster's booklet "7 Minutes With God," he suggests a way to begin: Start with a brief prayer for guidance, then read the

Bible for a few minutes, and close with a short time of prayer that includes adoration, confession, thanksgiving, and supplication for others. It's vital to take time today to connect with the Lord, who is our life.

Deacon's Report - Kevin Lee

Last year, we had a one-day men's conference in February with Pastor Paul Nash. It seemed to go well and had good participation. We tied it in with our theme (Bible study topic) for the year. We want to plan something like this again. Pastor Kent has two pastors in mind as possibilities. Pastor Andy Coyle, who planted and serves the congregation in the Black Hills of SD. He was also a missionary to Ukraine for a time. The other is Pastor Adam Osier, who serves as dean of our Bible College.

Pastor has meetings for the AFLC World Missions Committee in Minneapolis December 3rd-4th. The Bible College has their winter concerts on those same dates. He would like to attend the concerts as Rachel will be performing (and as in-person attendance was not allowed last year). But it would mean missing church on the 5th. In terms of vacation time, he has one last Sunday available. For these reasons, Pastor asked if it's possible to take Sunday, Dec. 5th as a vacation day. The deacons agreed that this would be good. Les Buchman could teach adult Sunday School during Pastor's absence. Seth agreed to preach on Sunday the 5th of December.

Youth ministry update – Seth reported that the youth programs continue to thrive by the grace of God. Seth will continue to attend Deacon meetings where he can contribute to discussions and report on his daily activities for the church.

The deacons agreed to give \$500.00 to the Beulah ministerial for helping those in need.

Trustee's Report - Ryan Tolosky

The concrete contractor was delayed this year due to situations out of his control.

Keith fixed lots of things over the course of 2021. Replaced many lights in the fellowship hall. The Sunday school room was remodeled by Keith and other members of the congregation. Broken floor tiles were replaced in the Sunday school rooms and

fellowship hall. The insulation in the ceiling of the fellowship hall was secured to the ceiling joists to prevent future sagging and falling insulation. I am sure he did way more than what is listed here.

In the early part of November, the fellowship hall floor was waxed. We will continue as needed and when time permits to wax the Sunday school rooms, kitchen, hallway to the warehouse and warehouse kitchen.

Jeff has been working on computer/sound booth projects throughout the year

Will need to replace the outside entry door to the warehouse.

Will need to look at purchasing a new lawn mower for next year.

Garage project is still being discussed and planned. Dustin was working on getting a couple of bids from some local contractors.

There is a sign-up sheet being passed around to volunteer to shovel/snow blow around the church during the snowy months. This is just for the sidewalks and steps. The parking lots are cleared with machinery.
