### Pastor Kent

*"For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another. For the whole law is fulfilled in one word: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself.""*  
(Galatians 5:13-14 ESV)

As believers, we take comfort in the great freedom we have in Christ. We take comfort in the fact that we can do nothing to earn or to become deserving of God's blessings. And we take comfort in the fact that forgiveness and salvation have been provided to us as a free gift.

Yet, even though this is true, we still tend to get caught up by law. In our effort to live for the Lord, we tend to make value judgments. We make such judgments based on our own experience. And we, then, hold others to these standards.

One place we see this, and one place where it is argued extensively, is when it comes to the way in which we dress. If you, for example, attend a youth retreat or conference, girls are often told that they can wear only a one-piece swimsuit. Bikinis, in other words, are not allowed.

This rule is put in place because of a simple reality. Although it's true of men in general, it's especially true that teenage boys tend to struggle with lust. This, of course, is sinful. And being in the presence of girls, who are almost naked, does nothing to help in this regard.

This argument surrounds not only bikinis, but also leggings or yoga pants, because of their form-fitting nature. And many Christian women are quick to say that they should not be punished because of a problem possessed by men. They should have the freedom to wear whatever they please, and whatever they find comfortable. Men, they tell us, should deal with their own issue and not place the burden of it upon women.

Both sides of this debate have valid points to consider, and either can be taken to an extreme. Both sides of this debate also share something else in common: They focus their attention only on the other side of the issue. They look at what others can do for them, rather than what they can do for others.

It's true that men are responsible for their own temptation and sin. The burden of controlling these desires cannot be rightfully thrust upon women. Men cannot and should not constrain women based upon their own sinful desires. They should not dictate to women what they should and shouldn't wear. They must recognize their sin, confess it to the Lord, beseech his forgiveness, and seek his strength that they might live in a way that is pleasing to God.

Women, however, should consider the needs of those who surround them. They should not be concerned only, or even primarily, with their own desires or comfort. In all things, they should seek to serve their neighbor. And this includes the clothing they choose to wear.

In saying this, I don't intend to lay down any rules or guidelines for you. We must recognize that much of this is cultural. Here in the United States, it isn't considered revealing or immoral for women to wear shorts. In India, however, for a woman's ankles to be visible is considered quite risqué. Shorts are not acceptable even for men. And other standards, other definitions of modesty, apply in other parts of the world. It's hard, then, for us to set a guideline that applies across the board in the church.

When I've traveled to India, where it is very hot, I haven't worn shorts even though it would've been much more comfortable to do so. I concerned myself not with my comfort, but with the sensitivities of others. Here in America, however, I feel free to do so.

What it comes down to is this: Although we certainly do have freedom, we are not to use our freedom as an opportunity for the flesh. We are not to use our freedom as an excuse for sin. We are, rather, to use our freedom to serve one another.

Paul brings it back to the one standard that applies in every situation. He reminds us that the whole law is fulfilled in one word. And that word, to which he's referring, is that we should love our neighbor as ourself.

Our focus as we make decisions, then, is not ourselves. Our focus is not our own desires. Our neighbor is to be our focus. And we're to consider his needs ahead of our own.

### The Intern's Corner

Romans 15:4–7 (ESV) — *4 For whatever was written in former days was written for our **instruction**, that through endurance and through the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope. 5 May the God of endurance and encouragement grant you to live in such **harmony** with one another, in accord with Christ Jesus, 6 that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. 7 Therefore **welcome** one another as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God.*

Three weighty words stuck out to me as I was reading through this text recently that seemed fitting to share for my first month in this “internship corner” of the newsletter.

First, Paul here calls the saints at Rome to “**welcome**” one another. Sarah and I have seen this command carried out wonderfully by you, dear saints, during our first weeks here. From excellent moving help to conversations and advice over food, we have been blessed to be on the receiving end of this welcoming. Since Sarah and I both grew up as Pastor's kids moving between churches over the years (check out my bio on the Staff portion of the church website for more info), it is refreshing to be old enough now to fully appreciate the amount of work it takes to welcome in a new family to your community, congregation, and even your very hearts. I pray that you would continue to show us this same kindness and

teach us to do the same for those we ourselves will need to welcome in the future.

Second, Paul here points out that the Scriptures were written for our “**instruction**.” These last three years of seminary (and even the years before them of Bible School and College) have been full of instruction. However, our leaders who seek to train pastors to serve our AFLC wisely understood that instruction in the Word can only go so far in the classroom setting. Being instructed in the Word of God must include learning to apply and share the Word of God. During this year in the congregation, my understanding of God’s Word and the direct application of it will be fine-tuned through Pastor Sperry’s guidance and your own needs, insight, and ever-changing lives. To be instructed in God’s Word is to be transformed by it and ready to share it at every point in life’s joys and sorrows.

Finally, Paul calls for believers to be of one voice, living in “**harmony**” with each other. I am no Beethoven, but I can appreciate the musical image the comes to mind when I hear this word. Harmony is not singing the same note. Instead, harmony is different notes sung or played together to make a beautiful chord or chord progression. In the case of the congregation, harmony represents everyone working towards love and the sharing of God’s Word yet doing so through their own unique gifts and skills. Even in these short weeks I have seen many of you in action at VBS, services, and fellowship working together to accomplish something more profound than any individual could accomplish alone. As I learn how best to use my own gifts in

pastoral ministry, I am honored to see you all take this call to harmony seriously. Different gifts, yet one mission from one Savior, Christ. May He continue to bless this congregation, which has already been a remarkable blessing to us. Thank you for everything: I look forward to walking through this year with you all!

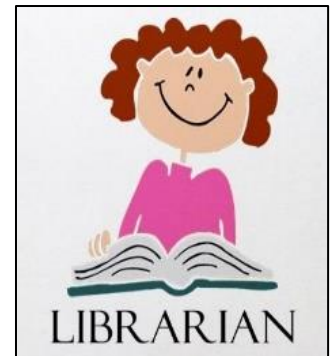

# Youth

## Manner of Life

“Only let your manner of life be worthy of the gospel of Christ”

Philippians 1:27a

I came across this verse on its own recently, and as of late it has become one of my favorite verses. It’s a simple verse, but I think for me, it very very simply sums up the reality of God’s law and also the Gospel of Jesus’ death and resurrection.

The relationship between Law and Gospel has been a struggle for me and I know it has been for others. The struggle between “We need to do good things” (Law) and “God doesn’t need us to do anything” (Gospel) is a tough one. But I think this verse covers both sides very simply and efficiently. “Let the manner of your life,” or in other words, “In the way we act, talk, and think”...“Be worthy of the Gospel of Christ.” Which means exactly what it says, and it perfectly sums up how the Law and the Gospel works together, not separately (as many people think). We shouldn’t be a “good person” because it gets us anything, or because we need to get to heaven, or because we need to be “good people.” All that matters is that Jesus has died for us, whether we acknowledge that or not doesn’t change that it has happened. And because Jesus died for us, it is our job to let that reflect in our life, and to do our best to make our life and the decisions be *Worthy* of the reality that Jesus died for it. One of my favorite quotes is, “Is what you’re living for

worth Christ dying for?” Basically this verse wrapped up in a small quote.

So, our job is to simply “Let your manner of life be worthy of the Gospel of Christ.” And we don’t do this because we need to, or because we always love to, and it’s certainly not because God needs us to. No; we desire to let our life be worthy of Jesus’ death and resurrection for the same reason that we forgive others: we do it because Jesus asks us to. And for all that Jesus does and did for us, we can quickly realize that our life is not our own but rather a gift from God, and the rich and joyous blessing that that reality is.

Intern Update – Joe will be preaching and leading worship when Pastor Kent is gone, on June 26<sup>th</sup> and July 17<sup>th</sup>. He will be the service leader for the communion service when Pastor Kent is gone on July 3<sup>rd</sup>. We discussed the Trinity Parish wanting Joe to preach once a month. Joe seemed open to that and helping with emergencies.

The Beulah Community Church service will be held on July 10<sup>th</sup> at 10:30 at the high school. We typically cancel our service at POP that day and encourage our members to attend the community service.

Youth director search – Cody Halverson will be with us on Saturday and Sunday, June 11<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>. He'll interview with the council and call committee at 1:00 on Saturday. He will then be given a tour of the area. We will have a "make your own pizza" event with him and some of the youth at 7:00 that night, followed by a Bible study Cody is preparing for the youth. We'll have a time of Q & A with the congregation after worship on Sunday. And he'll interact with the congregation during fellowship hour. We would then need to schedule a congregational meeting to vote on whether to extend a call to him.

### **Trustee's Report – Ryan Tolosky**

Ryan and Bruce Neuberger met and looked at the Warehouse door. Bruce is getting bids for the door.

Dustin Buchmann purchased a new riding lawn mower for the church.

The church congregation approved spending up to \$75,000 for the storage building. Bids have been coming in for the Van Storage Building. Council agreed having the Trustees, Kevin Lee and Marvin Sigman look over the bids next week and make a decision on which company to use. Companies have indicated that construction materials prices are changing daily so a timely decision needs to be made.

The flashing on the steeple was fixed and Ryan will get the bill from that company.

Terry Barden will give Ryan an estimate for Belzona product to seal the crack between the building and sidewalk.

They discussed the video cameras – 6 out of 7 cameras are now working  
Had training on patient evaluation during the meeting.

### **Christian Ed Report – Angie Wanzek**

Angie reported that VBS had a lot of adult helpers which was great. The first 4 nights between 58-60 kids attending. Saturday morning had about 46 kids attending. Christian Ed discussed that it went well not having a Bible School team. Next year they will have a mom's room since there were a lot of moms there with smaller kids that hung out in the nursery. The kids brought 733 pounds of food to donate to WARC.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

**Copier** – We are still waiting for the copier. We will stay in touch with Darcee Wenning, the Office Coordinator, to make sure our current copier continues to work.

### **Youth Director Call Committee –**

We approved a Letter of Call to present to the congregation if the congregation votes to call Cody Halverson as a Youth Director.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

**Tithe** - We voted to split our tithe of \$3,254.79: \$500 to Free Lutheran Bible College and \$2,754.79 to AFLC Parish Education.

**Coat Ministry** – Margaret Roseann approached Pastor Kent about beginning a coat ministry for people that need coats. She would collect donations of coats and need a room in the church for the coats. Council agreed this would be a great ministry.

**Church in the Park** – Angie Wanzek reported that Christian Ed usually hosts a service in the park after VBS but they have already had VBS. She asked if it was something the church wanted to do again and the council agreed it was something that some members enjoyed. Christian Ed will discuss a date during their next meeting.

**Correspondence**

Thank you notes were received from Free Lutheran Bible College & Seminary, AFLC World Missions and AFLC Headquarters for our financial gifts and prayers. Also received a thank you note from WARC for 733 pounds of food donated by kids during Vacation Bible School.

**Special Congregational Meeting**

Marvin Sigman; Chairman called the meeting to order.

Garrett Placke, member of the Youth Director Call Committee, presented the Call Letter details to call Cody Halverson as our Youth Director. Cody has been video interviewed by the Call Committee, had an in-person interview with the Call Committee and Church Council, participated in a youth event and led the Bible study and answered questions in front of the congregation.

Details of the Call Letter are as follows:

- \$45,000 base salary to be pro-rated for 2022
- Medical expenses including insurance premiums to be self-funded
- \$600 Continuing Education
- \$600 Annual Conference
- Mileage up to \$2,000 (current IRS rates) when using personal vehicle for church-related activities
- 12 days of vacation based upon a 6-day work week – Vacation will be pro-rated for 2022

- Paid moving expenses such as using a U-Haul

Marvin Sigman gave a devotion and prayed before continuing the meeting.

*Garrett Placke moved that the congregation extend a Letter of Call to Cody Halverson as Prince of Peace's Youth Director. Darcee Wenning seconded the motion.*
