"Therefore, my beloved brothers, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain."

(1 Corinthians 15:58 ESV)

This was the confirmation verse assigned to me by my pastor on the day when I publicly confessed my faith before the congregation. And I believe that he assigned it to me knowing my calling. He assigned it to me knowing that I was being led by the Lord into the pastoral ministry.

This verse certainly does speak to me, it certainly does minister to me, as I carry out this calling. It's been a good reminder to me throughout the years. However, it's a verse that speaks to all of us.

It speaks to all of us because, as we serve the Lord, we often become tired. As we seek to serve the church, we often become worn down. And as we

deal with not only the people of our society who surround us from day to day, but also the children of God, we often become frustrated.

We are often left feeling unsatisfied. We are often left feeling unfulfilled. And we are often left feeling like our efforts are accomplishing nothing.

For this reason, we wonder if it's worth it. We feel like throwing in the towel. In fact, we feel like giving up altogether.

And many times, we do just that. In our fatigue, we pull back. In our frustration, we give up. In our exasperation, we resign from the role we've been filling.

This can happen whether it's a role we're filling at church, at home, on the job, or in the community. We simply cease doing the things we've always done. And we no longer try to fill the needs that we once satisfied.

It's in these circumstances that the words of the apostle Paul, in the passage above, speak to us. He encourages us to be steadfast, to be firmly based. He encourages us to be unmovable. He encourages us to be always abounding, always over and above, when it comes to the work of the Lord. And we're to do so knowing that, in the Lord, our labor is never in vain.

No matter how things may seem, our labor is never meaningless. No matter how it may feel, our labor is never empty. No matter the apparent results, or lack of them, we can be assured that our labor in the Lord is always accomplishing something, even if we cannot see it.

The Intern's Corner

2 Samuel 9:6–8 and 13 (ESV) — ⁶ And Mephibosheth the son of Jonathan, son of Saul, came to David and fell on his face and paid homage. And David said, "Mephibosheth!" And he answered, "Behold, I am your servant." And David said to him, "Do not fear, for I will show you kindness for the sake of your father Jonathan, and I will restore to you all the land of Saul your father, and you shall eat at my table always." ⁸ And Mephibosheth paid homage and said, "What is your servant, that you should show regard for a dead dog such as I?"...¹³ So Mephibosheth lived in Jerusalem, for he ate always at the king's table. Now he was lame in both his feet.

This text always resonates deeply with me. If you have a minute, open your Bible and read through all of 2 Samuel chapter 9. (If you want more context, work through 1 and 2 Samuel a little bit each day and notice David's rise and Saul's fall). It is remarkable what happens in today's text. David had just secured his rule over all of Israel. The Ark of the Covenant had been returned to Jerusalem. David was in the midst of conquering the surrounding nations. God had blessed David and His rule in many ways after raising him up to replace Saul.

But then, almost at the peak of his rule, David asks about any remaining relatives of Saul. For most ancient kings, this was a common question. Normal kings wanted to know about any of the previous dynasty's offspring so they could take them out and remove other claims to the throne. But David asks about Saul's line for a different reason: to show mercy on them.

Saul and most of his line had been wiped out years ago, but there was one link remaining: Mephibosheth. Mephibosheth was the son of Jonothan, David's dearest friend from years past. Mephibosheth was the grandson of Saul, a man whom David held in high regard as the Lord's anointed despite all of Saul's struggles and even attempts to kill David.

Mephibosheth came to David expecting nothing but death. He may have heard of Jonothan and David's great friendship, but surely David had summoned Mephibosheth to dispose of him and end the line of Saul. It's just what kings did. Not to mention, Mephibosheth was a cripple, having been made so as a child when he was dropped in the chaos that follow the murder of his uncle (2 Sam. 4:4). Mephibosheth had nothing of value to offer David, be it wealth or strength. Mephibosheth had not had it easy and was expecting only more sorrows, if not death, from David.

But David does the opposite of what's expected. He speaks kindly to Mephibosheth. He returns land to Mephibosheth and his helpers. David even raises up Mephibosheth to eat at his very own royal table. This is a wonderful story of mercy and restitution. Good returned for Saul's evil. Love for Jonothan carried on to the next generation.

But reading this account, like all of Scripture, should ultimately guide our eyes to see Christ, the new and greater David. Christ takes this merciful kindness of David towards one man and enlarges it billions of times to every man, woman, and child.

Like David, Jesus rules and reigns. Jesus, the New David, will finish conquering all of His enemies soon. But the New David also searches out for those to show mercy on: the crippled offspring of His beloved Adam. Just like David used to take sweet council with Jonothan or even Saul, God used to walk with and delight in the pinnacle of creation, Adam, who was made in His image. But Adam and Eve fell into sin, they had to be removed, like Saul.

Yet, the New David came and, after suffering for sin and rising from the dead, took back the royal office that Adam was designed for. But Jesus didn't stop there. The New David sought out the offspring of Adam: you and me and the whole world. He saw us in our brokenness. He saw us crippled by our sin and our pride. But the New David shed His blood to atone for our sin. Then the New David spoke tenderly to us. Jesus calls us, though we are nothing but "dead dogs" (as Mephibosheth would say) that cannot save ourselves or offer Him anything. Jesus still calls us to be His. He raises us up to His royal table. He restores that which was lost and places us in positions of honor to rejoice at His coming victory over all His enemies (sin, death, and the Devil) on the last day.

This text is one of my favorites because it shows off our merciful Savior. The kindness of David's line was made perfect in Christ. The love of God is given without measure to us, even though we are merely sinful offspring of Adam, crippled and unable to

help ourselves like Mephibosheth. This text is beautiful because it shows us not only how to carry out great kindness from man to man, but also points us ahead to the perfect kindness of the Son of Man to every son and daughter of Adam. Thanks be to God that the New David calls, raises up, and restores us helpless ones!

How to know you're going to Heaven. By Curtis Hutson

FIRST YOU MUST ACCEPT THAT YOU ARE A SINNER.

For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God. Rom. 3:23

"As it is written, There is none righteous, No, not one" Rom.3:10

No one is perfect. No one has lived up to God's perfect standard.

SECOND, YOU MUST ACCEPT THAT AS A SINNER YOU OWE A PENALTY.

"For the wages of sin is death". Rom.6:23. "The soul that sinneth, it shall die." Ezek. 18:4.

This death is descried in the Bible as the second death, the lake of fire.

"Death and hell were cast into the lake of fire. This is the second death" Rev.20:14 THIRD, YOU MUST ACCEPT THAT JESUS CHRIST HAS ALREADY PAID YOU SIN DEBT.

"For when we were yet without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly. Rom. 5:6

"that he by the grace of God should taste death for every man." Heb. 2:9.

"For I delivered unto you first all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures; And that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures." 1 Cor. 15:3-4.

Christ was not a sinner, and the Bible teaches that God took all of our sin and placed it on Christ. While Christ was bearing all of our sins in His own body, God sacrificed Him in our place to pay the debt

we owe. This is not something God has promised He will do. It is something God has already done.

"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish. But have everlasting life." John 3:16.

"For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin: that we might be made the righteousness of God in him." II Corinthians 5:21.

FOURTH, YOU MUST ACCEPT BY FAITH WHAT JESUS CHRIST DID FOR YOU.

Dozens of times in the Gospel of John the Bible says, "BELIEVE."

"He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life: and he that believeth not the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abideth on him. John 3:36.

In this verse, Jesus divides the world into two groups: those who are believing and those who are not believing on the Son. Those who believe have everlasting life, and those who believe not shall not see life. The word believe means "to trust, to depend on, to rely on." To believe on the Lord Jesus Christ means that you accept the facts that you are a sinner, that as a sinner you owe the sin penalty, and that Jesus Christ died on the cross and arose from the grave to pay the debt you owe. But it means going one step further. It means that you will completely trust Christ to get you to Heaven--- that you will put the matter of your salvation into His hands and depend on Him for everlasting

Now the moment you do this, God promises that you are not condemned but that you have everlasting life and you shall not perish.

"Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that heareth my word, and believeth on him that sent me, hath everlasting life, and shall not come into condemnation; but is passed from death unto life." John 5:24 In Christ Marvin C. Sigman

The different shifts begin at 2:00pm on Friday and conclude at 5:00pm on Saturday – so there are lots of time slots to pick from.




