"...aspire to live quietly, and to mind your own affairs, and to work with your hands, as we instructed you, so that you may walk properly before outsiders and be dependent on no one."

(1 Thessalonians 4:11–12 ESV)

People, today, have an opinion on everything. They seem to believe that they are experts when it comes to each and every subject. They think they know the best course of action when it comes to politics, world affairs, economics, and even sports.

They are also nosy. They want to know what's going on in the lives of those around them. And they seem to think they have the answers to everyone else's problems.

Additionally, we live in a society where everyone wants to be heard. They want to be recognized. And they want to stand out.

With the advent of social media, it even feels as though this is within our reach. We aspire to be the

next YouTube sensation, or the next internet celebrity. We aspire to be the next great influencer. We seek to do so by making our every thought, our every viewpoint, known to anyone and everyone.

We are loud-mouths. We're blowhards. We're absolute windbags.

This is true of us, even as believers in Jesus. It's true of us as churches. We want to express our every opinion, and we do so tactlessly.

The principle cited by Paul, in the above passage, is absolutely foreign to us. It's one that most of us would never even consider. He tells us to aspire to live quietly and to mind our own affairs.

Rather than expressing every opinion and constantly attempting to be heard, we're to work with our hands. In other words, we're to speak less and toil more. We're to pursue a peaceful existence, seeking only to carry out our duties and vocations.

The result, he says, is that we'll walk properly before outsiders. We'll be respected by outsiders.

And, as we focus on our responsibilities, we will not find ourselves in need.

So, in this age of opinionated expression, may we learn to keep our thoughts to ourselves. In this age of unfettered assertion, may we mind our own business. May we tend to our responsibilities, seeking to live a quiet and a peaceful existence.

The Intern's Corner

In my September 18th sermon, I talked about God's will in 4 simple words: *show*, *know*, *grow*, and *flow*. Below you will find some Scriptures to chew on for each one of these four areas. I pray they will assist you as you look back over your personal sermon notes about where show, know, grow, and flow can appear in your own life in very specific ways. (All Scriptures are from the ESV).

SHOW: God wants to show us our sin and our Savior. God reveals Himself as the creator through the majesty of creation. God reveals Himself as the just God through His Law. God reveals Himself as the savior through the work of His Son. God's Word condemns your sin and saves you through faith in Christ's work alone.

Rom. 1:18–20 — For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who by their unrighteousness suppress the truth. For what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them. For his invisible attributes, namely, his eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made. So they are without excuse.

Rom. 3:21–26 — But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it—the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a propitiation by his

blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins. It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.

KNOW: God wants us to know His will, digging deeper into the Word so that we might have confidence in who He is and what He has done for us. Studying the Word reveals the connection all Scripture shares through Christ. It also lays a foundation on which our love can grow from.

Acts 17: 10–12 — The brothers immediately sent Paul and Silas away by night to Berea, and when they arrived they went into the Jewish synagogue. Now these Jews were more noble than those in Thessalonica; they received the word with all eagerness, examining the Scriptures daily to see if these things were so. Many of them therefore believed, with not a few Greek women of high standing as well as men.

Heb. 10:19–23 — Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful.

GROW: God wants us to grow from His love in our lives. The Word of God planted deep inside of us is grown by the Holy Spirit. Love is the fruit that will be seen here. Simple service that loves our neighbors is our aim.

Heb. 10:24–25 — And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.

Titus 2:11–14 — For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation for all people, training us to renounce ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright, and godly lives in the present age, waiting for our blessed hope, the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ, who gave himself for us to redeem us from all lawlessness and to purify for himself a people for his own possession who are zealous for good works.

John 13:34–35 — A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.”

FLOW: God wants our love to flow outwards as we bring others to Him. The love of others given to us by God compels us to share the Word of God with our friends and neighbors. We also are to lift up prayers for those near to us and those far away. Here the cycle of the Christian life continues to carry out God’s will to save all of mankind.

1 Tim. 2:1–2 —First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way.

2 Tim. 2:24–26 — And the Lord's servant must not be quarrelsome but kind to everyone, able to teach, patiently enduring evil, correcting his opponents with gentleness. God may perhaps grant them repentance leading to a knowledge of the truth, and they may come to their senses and escape from the

snare of the devil, after being captured by him to do his will.

Remember: SHOW, KNOW, GROW, and FLOW *all* come from the one sure will of God: your eternal salvation through Christ

2 Tim. 2:1 — You then, my child, be strengthened by the grace that is in Christ Jesus.

Isaiah 45:22 — Turn to me and be saved, all the ends of the earth! For I am God, and there is no other.

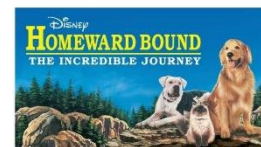

We had our mobile packing event September 23 and 24. We packed 95,040 meals which will feed 260 children. There were 245 volunteers to help pack meals. We would like to thank everyone who helped set up, clean up, pack, pray, fundraise etc. It took a lot of people to accomplish this goal! Due to the success of our fundraising we able to purchase 124k meals. Since we didn't quite meet our packing goal, those meals will be packed at one of the permanent sites and will be delivered to hungry children so ultimately, we will feed 341 children this year. We are already working on our next year. We will be serving lunch at Shop 'til You Drop October 29th at the Civic Center in Beulah. I am not sure of the complete menu, but it will include fleshckuchkle! We may be in need of some bars and knoepla soup makers. I will keep you posted as we haven't finalized the details quite yet. Again thanks for all that you do!

Intern Update – Joe filled us in on his activities for the past month. He's preached at POP as well as Dodge. He's been helping with both the high school and the middle school youth groups. He's preached at the nursing home. He just taught Wednesday night Bible study. He will also be teaching confirmation and adult Sunday School on occasion.

Youth ministry update – Cody filled us in on the start of youth group and Middle School Bible study, as well as the curriculum he's using. He also mentioned the curriculum he'll be using for Sunday School, which is the same as Pastor Kent is using for the adults. The deacons asked him, for the time being, to turn in a time sheet each month to give them a feel for the hours he's working.

Spiritual Life Meetings –Pastor Jeff Swanson will speak at our fall meetings. We set dates of October 16th-19th. Kevin Lee will soon get in touch with him to get his theme and topics so we can promote them.

For the Men's Retreat, in October, we're responsible for the Friday night meal. Dates are October 28th-29th.

Trustee's Report – Ryan Tolosky

Still working on the van storage building. Need to put up the railing on the north walkway. The pavement is repaired by the new cement. The doors will be really late for the garage since they weren't ordered on time. The green fridge in the Warehouse is leaking water and may need to be thrown away.

Christian Ed Report – Angie Wanzek

Sunday school: We discussed what needed to be ordered for books & classroom divisions/arrangements.

Prayer Partners for Confirmation: Angie will be taking care of this.

Sunday school kids will be writing out cards for veterans to be given out to honor them.

We discussed a community outreach event for October 9th, 2022 to provide supper and a movie in conjunction with the coat closet opening.

NEW BUSINESS

Tithe - We voted to split our tithe of \$2,120.81: \$300 to Feed My Starving Children Mobile Pack, \$1,820.81 to the AFLC ARC in Wisconsin.

Discussed giving an offering for our District Family Camp which may come from the Deacon's budget.

Devotionals – Approved Kelsey Glynn providing a rack of free devotional materials with the Deacons possibly providing some of their budget for this mission.

Kids Offering – Approved having a “noisy offering” taken by kids. Kelsey Glynn presented an idea of kids walking through the congregation with empty cans to collect loose change offering periodically-hence the name “noisy offering”.
