Although it seems that we just finished our Christmas celebration, our celebration of Jesus' birth, another important season is upon us. Later this month, on the 22nd, we'll enter into the season of Lent. We'll enter into this season of repentance and preparation for our celebration of Easter, of Jesus' resurrection from the grave.

On the Wednesdays of Lent, the youth and their families will once again serve meals, prior to our Lenten services. This makes it easy for families to attend our Wednesday night activities, as they don't have to come home from work and prepare a meal for themselves. It also provides a wonderful time of fellowship for church members and guests of all

ages. And it provides an opportunity for our young people to raise money for their youth accounts as they receive a free-will offering on the night they serve. Please plan to join us each week for these meals at 5:45.

We'll also be sharing two series of messages as we look forward to Easter. On the Sundays of Lent, Joe and I will share a series titled, *Triumphs of the Cross*. Each week, we'll learn of a blessing provided by Jesus' sacrifice, which fills us with hope. Our Wednesday series will be a little more introspective in nature. Joe, Cody, and myself will share a series titled, *Lenten Questions*. Each week, we'll look at a question asked by Jesus or someone else in Scripture and how it applies to us, today.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, on February 22nd. This service will be a communion service. We will also give you the opportunity for the imposition of ashes, which is a sign of repentance, as well as a reminder of the fate we deserve and the promise of the gospel.

During Holy Week, we'll join for worship on Maundy Thursday, which commemorates Jesus' command to love one another, as well as his institution of the Lord's Supper. This will be a communion service as well. And we'll join for worship on Good Friday, as we remember and celebrate Jesus' death on the cross, and the blessings he provided for us by this act.

The Saturday before Easter, Christian Ed will again host an Easter party at the church for the children of our community and their families. They will decorate cookies and eat them, of course! They'll make a craft. They'll hear the Easter story. And they'll participate in an Easter egg hunt.

Finally, we'll have two opportunities for worship on Easter morning, with breakfast served by the youth in between. A free-will offering will again be collected during this meal to help the youth attend retreats and other activities. We hope you can join us during this special season of the church year, and bring with you friends and family who may find it meaningful!

From afraid-to-die to ready-to-fly. Grace is the voice that calls us to change and then gives us the power to pull it off. IN Christ Marvin C. Sigman.

It was good to get started on our new WMF Bible study. We looked at Eve, the first woman in the Old Testament. Eve was a woman "Rescued from Shame". She disobeyed God's only rule in the Garden of Eden, "You may surely eat of every tree of the garden, but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that your eat of it you shall surely die." (Genesis 2:16-17) The serpent tempted Eve with words that brought doubt as to God's word. He said that God didn't really mean that they would die. Each Christmas, a church member anonymously gives me \$500 to share with someone in need. They prefer that it go to a congregation member. The Deacons decided it would be good this year for the \$500 to go to Cody and Sierra to help with frozen water pipe expenses.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on February 22nd. We'll plan for Lent meals, put on by youth families as a fundraiser for their youth accounts, beginning at 5:45. We'll have worship at 7:00 each week. We'll have a series of messages running on Sundays, which Joe and Pastor Kent will share, and another series on Wednesdays which will be shared by Pastor, Cody, and Joe. And for Holy Week, we'll have our typical Maundy Thursday communion service, Good Friday service, and our two Easter Sunday services with breakfast in between (again, put on by the youth).

Spiritual Life Meetings – Pastor Kent contacted Pastor Michael Brandt to share with us for our spring

Spiritual Life Meetings. He accepted, and we scheduled the meetings for April 16th-19th. He also has a ministry called "Shepherding the Shepherds." Pastor Brandt asked if he could some time to work with those available from council on Saturday, April 15th from 9:00-12:00. It would consist of ministry assessment and strategic planning.

<u>Trustees – Ryan Tolosky</u>

We have \$9,000 left to pay on the building. Bruce Neuberger has been taking care of the building. Ryan thanked everyone that has been helping with snow removal. Ryan had Dale Schwalbe take care of moving snow Christmas weekend.

NEW BUSINESS

Tithe – We voted to split our tithe of \$2,948.19 with \$800 to be given to Grace Sperry for her upcoming Uganda Mission Trip and \$1,948.19 to the AFLC ARC. We also voted to give \$200 from the Annual Conference/Training budget item to Grace for her upcoming Uganda Mission Trip based on what we have given to others in the past depending upon the length of their mission trips.

University of Jamestown Concert – We approved hosting the University of Jamestown choir concert on Monday, March 6. Our obligations would be to have someone man the south booth, make rooms available for changing and have the kitchen open for an evening meal. POP could choose to feed the choir or someone else would be available to make a meal.

Hazen Task Force – We approved Cody Halverson being on the Hazen Task Force as part of his duties as our Youth Director. The task force works in Hazen and the surrounding communities. They meet the first Tuesday of each month and do planning like Post Prom, etc.

Hydraulic Man Lift – We approved Ryan Tolosky spending up to \$2,500 to purchase a used 110-volt hydraulic man lift he located in Bismarck. He will look at it in person before making the purchase to see if it would meet our needs.


Correspondence

Intern's Israel Corner – Feb. 2023: Masada

As we neared the southern end of Israel, following along the shores of the Dead Sea, we came upon a massive collection of plateaus and mesas. Thankfully, the location we wanted to visit was connected to our low elevation by a cable car. As we as made our way up to the most prominent peak, we were

hit with quite a view.



This was Masada. A massive jut of rock and stone with a very flat top. It was here that Herod, just before the time of Christ, built some serious fortifications and palaces. It was also here that Jewish rebels, after the destruction of the temple in AD 70, had fled.

Sticking out dramatically above the Dead Sea plains, this was a perfect location for a scenic view and an easily defendable fort. A few well-trained soldiers could defend this place from thousands of invaders. The natural climb up was treacherous and narrow. Even the Jewish rebels who came here were only reached by the Romans after huge mounds of

dirt were brought in week after week to get a siege machine near.

At its finest, Masada likely looked like this:



To support this sprawling fortress, a deep cistern was needed. We had plenty of room to move here, as it was dug deep into the rock. With no water, it had some acoustics!



It was these unique acoustics that brought a song to my mind. Standing on this massive stone peak, the words of *A Mighty Fortress is Our God* ran through my head.

1 A mighty fortress is our God, a bulwark never failing; our helper he, amid the flood of mortal ills prevailing. For still our ancient foe does seek to work us woe; his craft and power are great, and armed with cruel hate, on earth is not his equal.

Luther had based this hymn off of a Psalm:

Psalm 46:1 God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. 2 Therefore we will not fear though the earth gives way, though the mountains be moved into the heart of the sea, 3 though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble at its swelling. 4 There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High. 5 God is in the midst of her; she shall not be moved; God will help her when morning dawns. 6 The nations rage, the kingdoms totter; he utters his voice, the earth melts. 7 The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress. 8 Come, behold the works of the Lord, how he has brought desolations on the earth. 9 He makes wars cease to the end of the earth; he breaks the bow and shatters the spear; he burns the chariots with fire. 10 "Be still, and know that I am God. I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth!" 11 The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress.

Luther wrote his hymn as a reflection of the confidence that the Psalmist had in the might and power of God. Our God is still the same today. He is our Rock and our Redeemer. He is higher than the highest mesa and sturdier than the firmest cliff. No enemy or siege

machine can destroy those who stand by faith on the eternal rock.



Only ruins remain of Herod's mighty palace. But the rock we build on, Christ our Lord, will never fail us. If you trust in the Lord, His mighty hand will deliver you when you are in need. His call to us is the same today:

"Be still, and know that I am God."

I'll let Luther explain the details in closing: 2 Did we in our own strength confide, our striving would be losing, were not the right Man on our side, the Man of God's own choosing. You ask who that may be? Christ Jesus, it is he; Lord Sabaoth his name, from age to age the same; and he must win the battle.

3 And though this world, with devils filled, should threaten to undo us, we will not fear, for God has willed his truth to triumph through us. The prince of darkness grim, we tremble not for him; his rage we can endure, for lo! his doom is sure; one little word shall fell him.

4 That Word above all earthly powers no thanks to them abideth; the Spirit and the gifts are ours through him who with us sideth. Let goods and kindred go, this mortal life also; the body they may kill: God's truth abideth still; his kingdom is forever!
