"It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God.' " (Matthew 4:4 ESV)

The verse above shares with us the words of Jesus, as he was tempted by the devil in the wilderness. They were shared by Jesus, after fasting for forty days, as Satan tempted him to turn stones into bread. And he quoted these words from Deuteronomy 8:3.

His point, of course, is that life is found not only in bread. It's not only food that provides life for us. It's received also from the Word of God.

This life, however, is not physical in nature. And it is not worldly in nature. It's the eternal life that God has provided for us by the death and resurrection of Jesus.

Realizing this, our tendency to neglect God's Word becomes troublesome. If it's true that life is received from the Word of God, why would we neglect it? Doing so would mean denying ourselves the opportunity to receive the life that God has to offer.

That being said, I want to introduce you to two of the opportunities you'll have to dig into God's Word this upcoming fall. There are many others, of course. Look for opportunities to join together with the WMF (Women's Missionary Federation) study, our men's breakfast and study, and the numerous small groups that meet both here at the church and outside of it.

Typically, during our Adult Sunday School hour, I have taught from a curriculum. And they have usually been topical in nature. This year, however, we'll be going through the Gospel of Luke verse by verse.

Luke's intent, with his gospel, is to bring his reader to a certainty of faith. He wants us to have an assurance of faith. And as we read about all that Jesus said and did, we are given this blessing. This study will begin on Sunday, September 10th. If you like to prepare ahead of time, I'll have copies of the first lesson available on Sunday, September 3rd.

During our Wednesday night Bible study, we'll look at the other writing of Luke, the book of Acts, verse by verse. We'll see what happened to the Church after Jesus' resurrection from the grave and his ascension into heaven. And we'll see how the Holy Spirit empowered his Church to carry out his work.

This study will begin on Wednesday, August 30th. And, again, I'll have copies of the first lesson available a week ahead of time.

Although none of us are able to take advantage of every opportunity to hear and study God's Word, my hope and prayer is that each of us will get involved in at least one. We can expect that, as we do so, not only will we learn. We'll also receive the blessing of life that is given to us by the Word.

Whoever confesses that Jesus is the Son of God, God abides in him, and he in God. 1 John 4:15

Paul said, "It is no longer I who live, But Christ lives in me" (Galatians 2:20. When grace happens, Christ enters. "Christ in you, the hope of glory" (Colossians 1:27).

For many years I missed this truth. I believed all the other prepositions: Christ for me, with me, ahead of me. And I knew I was working beside Christ, under Christ, With Christ. But I never imagined that Christ was in me.

No other religion or philosophy makes such a claim. No other movement implies the living presence of its founder in his followers. Influence? Instruct? Entice? Yes. But occupy? No.

Yet Christians embrace this inscrutable promise, "The mystery is a nutshell is just this: Christ is in you" (Colossians 1:27 msg). The Christian is a person in whom Christ is happening.

We are Jesus Christ's we belong to him. But even more, we are increasingly him. He moves in and commandeers our hands and feet, requisitions our minds and tongues. He repurposes bad decisions and squalid choices. Little by little a new image emerges. "He decided from the outset to shape the lives of those who love him along the same lines as the life of his Son" (Romans 8:29 msg).


OCC Donation schedule

Church Community Safety Meeting – This community church meeting has been moved to August 23. It was approved at our June Council Meeting to be held in our Fellowship Hall. Police Chief Senn will present information. This meeting will be informal discussing who is doing what, who is considering new safety measures and what kind of response there has been within their church body. The meeting would not be geared for the entire church but for a few people that represent their safety teams or the people interested in putting together a team for their church.
