# Pastor Kent

"...beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he interpreted to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning himself."
(Luke 24:27 ESV)

As we enter into February, love is on our mind. Love is on our mind because we associate this month with Valentine's Day. However, another important day falls on February 14th this year, alongside Valentine's Day.

This is also Ash Wednesday, marking the beginning of Lent. And, throughout the season of Lent, we have worship services on Wednesday evenings as we make a special effort to focus on Christ and all he's done for us.

On the Wednesdays of Lent, this year, as well as during our Holy Week and Easter services, we'll have a special focus. We'll hear a series of messages, titled: Scripture Fulfilled. And we'll see how all of Scripture is fulfilled in Jesus.

This is something that Jesus pointed out to two of his disciples, as they traveled on the road to Emmaus following his death on the cross and his resurrection from the grave. As they discussed everything that had taken place, Jesus joined them. And, although they didn't recognize him in the beginning, he told them that they were slow of heart to believe all that the prophets had spoken.

Then, beginning with Moses and all of the Prophets, he interpreted to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning himself. He revealed to them how all of Scripture pointed forward to him and what he was to accomplish. And although we don't know exactly what passages he used in doing so, we're going to do something very similar.

We're going to see how all of Scripture points us to Jesus and what he was to accomplish. And we won't be looking at the prophecies which are so clear that they cannot be denied. We'll be looking at certain events and people in Scripture that reveal this to us.

On the Sundays of Lent, we'll do something a little different. We'll be looking at the armor of God, about which Paul speaks in Ephesians 6. We'll be looking at what this armor is, why God has given it to us, and how we make use of it. We'll do so because, as Paul points out, we face a very real enemy who challenges us, seeking our downfall. And this armor is what enables us to stand against both him and his schemes.

Please make every effort to be with us during this very special season. As we engage with the Word of God in these ways, we'll each be immensely blessed. I look forward to sharing it with each of you!

#### From the Chairman

#### **Eternal Light**

"You shall command the people of Israel that they bring to you pure beaten olive oil for the light, that a lamp may regularly be set up to burn. In the tent of meeting, outside the veil that is before the testimony, Aaron and his sons shall tend it from evening to morning before the Lord. It shall be a statute forever to be observed throughout their generations by the people of Israel." Exodus 27:20-21

Light in worship has always had meaning for God's people. The sanctuary lights are lit whenever God's people gather. Light in worship has always had meaning for the faithful. From Old Testament times when the Lord commanded that a lamp be regularly set up to burn, then on into the early church. Our sanctuary at night glows with the red warmth of the "eternal Light," a candle also called a chancel lamp that is burned regularly in many churches. No matter the darkness of the sanctuary it still shines on and on until we gather again beneath its flickering light! I've always appreciated its beauty but more than that, it's meaning.

In worship, candle light not only brings warmth and beauty to our gathering but this candle that is never extinguished represents prayer and the presence of our Savior. In one ancient collect we pray, "We ask you to lighten the darkness of our hearts by your gracious visitation..." Jesus' visitation of grace for our world and our lives scatters the thick of darkness of sin around us. Peter describes our lives in faith as being called out of darkness into his marvelous light. This is a daily event that the Lord does in all of our lives of faith.

So, as we gather to celebrate the light of Christ we receive his word, which is a lamp unto our feet and light to our path. No matter the darkness of this world or the darkness of our own lives our Lord's light of salvation still shines for us, burning ever so brightly until the day we finally bask in his eternal light to come!

# CHURCH COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

January 11, 2024

President's Report – Marvin Sigman
Marvin met over the phone at the special council
meeting last Thursday regarding Darcee Wenning,
Church Coordinator leaving. He also met on Sunday
with the Personnel committee to decide how to
advertise for the Church Coordinator position.

Pastor's Report – Pastor Kent

Thank you for allowing me a few days away with my dad. It looked as if he wasn't going to make it, but he pulled through and improved a bit. His overall condition, however, has deteriorated. It's only a matter of time, and a short one at that. I may again have to go down to handle affairs when that time comes.

Activities for the past month (other than worship/sermon prep):

Attended our deacons meeting, and staff meetings.

Communed our residents at KRCC.

Conducted a memorial service for Gary Miller's son, Bien.

Confirmation has been going well. We're currently studying the Lord's Prayer.

Wednesday night Bible study continues to go well as we look at the book of Acts.

Adult Sunday School is also going well. For this class, we're studying the gospel of Luke.

I participated in our men's breakfast and led our study. We're looking at the life of David. We looked this past month at how God worked to protect David and to set the stage that he might assume the throne of Israel.

Deacon's Report – Kevin Lee

Brant Raan, missionary to Uganda, is planning furlough beginning in January. We'll be setting up a date/time soon for a visit/presentation.

Cody updated the deacons on the Beulah Ministerial Association discussions related to common beliefs required to be a part of the association. It is still under consideration.

Lent starts on February 14th this year, which will be the date of our Ash Wednesday service, and the start of our midweek services.

Youth ministry update: Cody gave a complete update on Middle school and High school youth happenings.

Cody will preach January 7th to cover for Pastor Kent. Steve will lead the service unless Pastor Kent makes it home in time for him to lead. Cody, Les, and Steve all offered to preach if needed during this time of need when Pastor is dealing with his ailing father.

Trustee's Report – Ryan Tolosky Ryan is working on getting estimates to replace the Warehouse door. He received an estimate of \$7,088.50 from Accurate Door in Bismarck. The door is a double door and they would reuse the handicap opener. We could get a keypad to open the door.

The council discussed the best position and size for windows in the door. Touching on safety and how low the windows would need to be for a wheelchair user to see out.

#### Safety Team – Garrett Placke

The Safety Team didn't meet in December but will meet next Tuesday. Darcee and Jim Wenning will be leaving the Safety Team as they are moving out of state. Garrett reported the team will have three or four new members joining the team

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

Policy Booklet – They are meeting on Monday, January 15 since a few other policies were found and may need to be added.

Lighting South Parking Lot – We need to look at getting better lighting for the south parking lot. The Safety Team will talk about this at their next meeting. Bruce Neuberger mentioned that the Condos have lights installed on each side of the building and they weren't too expensive.

Combining Lots – Ryan Tolosky reported that we own 8 lots. The City Auditor would like to combine the lots that our church sits on, including the south and north parking lots, into one parcel. The auditor said we would have a parcel number and the legal description would include the individual lots.

There are 4 lots that include the garage to the north. We discussed whether we would want these lots to be combined with the other lots or keep them separate.

Marge Lee will talk with Heidi the City Auditor to get more information.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Darcee Wenning, Church Coordinator – Our long-time Church Coordinator, Darcee Wenning, is moving out of state. We voted to gift her \$500 from the tithe for her service as our Church Coordinator for many years.

Anna Wenning Mission Trip – Anna Wenning is going on a Mission Trip to Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland in May 2024 with the University of Mary. She is asking for our prayers and financial assistance. We voted to give Anna \$500 from the tithe for her Mission Trip to Ireland.

Tithe – Our total tithe this month is \$3,762.75. We voted to give the remainder of our Tithe \$2,762.75 to the AFLC General Fund.

Interview Church Coordinator Candidates – We received one resume for the Church Coordinator position-Sierra Halverson. The Interview Committee of Garrett Placke, Jeff Rotondo, Carl Sorensen and Pastor Kent Sperry have an interview set up with Sierra.

#### Correspondence

Thank you note was received from Darcee Wenning for the Christmas gift the church gave her. Darcee also wrote a letter expressing her thoughts about leaving her job as Church Coordinator and how Prince of Peace Church is their family (letter inserted). Amy Haugen emailed the council thanking us for the Christmas gift from POP and for the Christmas Staff supper and council party. We also received a thank you from the Association Retreat Center (ARC) for our financial gift and from the Women's Care Center for POP's continued support.
